FOREIGN.

LONDON, 6.—The Morning Post published the following: We are assured that Roustan, French minister at Tunis, arrived in Paris to inform his government that the Bey is undoubtedly supporting the rebels; that he has received orders from Constantinople to encourage and aid with all the means in his power, a general insurrection, and unless Tunis is occupied and the Bey deposed, it will be utterly impossible for the French to act with any probability of success. We receive this information from a most trustworthy source.

The Globe says: Jefferson Davis arrived at Liverpool on Sunday, on the steamer Bernard Hall, from New Orleans. He is not in good health. After a short stay at the Adelphi Hotel, he left for London by the Midland railway. He declined an interview.

DUBLIN, 6.—The ten men who were arrested at Mill Street, on suspicion of being connected with the recent raid for arms at Pomeroy's house, were subsequently taken to George Street. This morning the people armed themselves and attempted to decoy the police from the barracks by means of false reports that several persons had been killed. The stratagem failed, or doubtless there would have been serious bloodshed. A large additional force of constabulary will be sent to Limerick.

ST. PETERSBURG, 6.—Two fresh numbers of the Nihilist Journal, the Will of the People, dated August 3d and 14th, have appeared in the form of supplements, promising the publication of a full number at the beginning of September. The numbers issued contain various notices, warning the spies of their faith, a list of donations to the revolutionary fund amounting to 5,000 roubles, a list of 400 Nihilists arrested since November, and an article condemning the Czar's policy and threatening to deal the final blow.

Accounts from the interior of Russia show that the anti-Jewish disorders are not the work of socialists. Tunis 6.—Two hundred armed Gabsis leaving Tunis passed near the French camp, nine miles from this city. The French fired upon the Gabsis, killing 10 and wounding 20. The Gabsis allege that they only carried arms to resist robbers.

Death of a Pioneer Lady.

SNOWFLAKE, A. T., Aug. 12, 1881.

Editor Deseret News:

Yesterday the citizens of this place were called to mourn the loss of one of their beloved members, Sister Margaret Jane Keartchner, wife of Wm. D. Keartchner, and daughter of Jacob T. Castele and Sarah Swan, who departed this life at 11 o'clock after a short illness of seven days.

The deceased was born in Cooper Co., Mo., Sept. 1, 1825. She was married to Wm. D. Keartchner in 1844, and with him passed through many trials and privations connected with the exodus of the Saints from Nauvoo. Journeying westward they reached the Pueblo, Col. where they spent the winter, and on the opening of spring pursued their journey, entering Salt Lake City with the Pioneers on the 24th of July, 1847.

She accompanied her husband to California who went there under the direction of Apostles Rich and Lyman in 1851, and returned to Utah in 1858, locating at Beaver. Her husband being called to go to the Muddy she again started to assist in building up another new settlement, and remained there until that place was abandoned, when they moved to Panguitch, where they remained until called to Arizona, where they moved in 1877.

She was the mother of 11 children, eight of whom are living and were present at her death, with one exception. She was the first of her father's family to join the Church, and has ever proved a faithful and worthy Latter-day Saint. She was a kind and affectionate mother, a loving and dutiful wife.

The funeral ceremonies were held to-day, in the Snowflake School-house, at 11 a.m., at which instructive and consoling remarks were made by Elders S. H. Rogers, J. N. Perkins and Bishop John Hunt.

The deceased leaves a wide circle of relatives and friends, who will deeply mourn her loss.

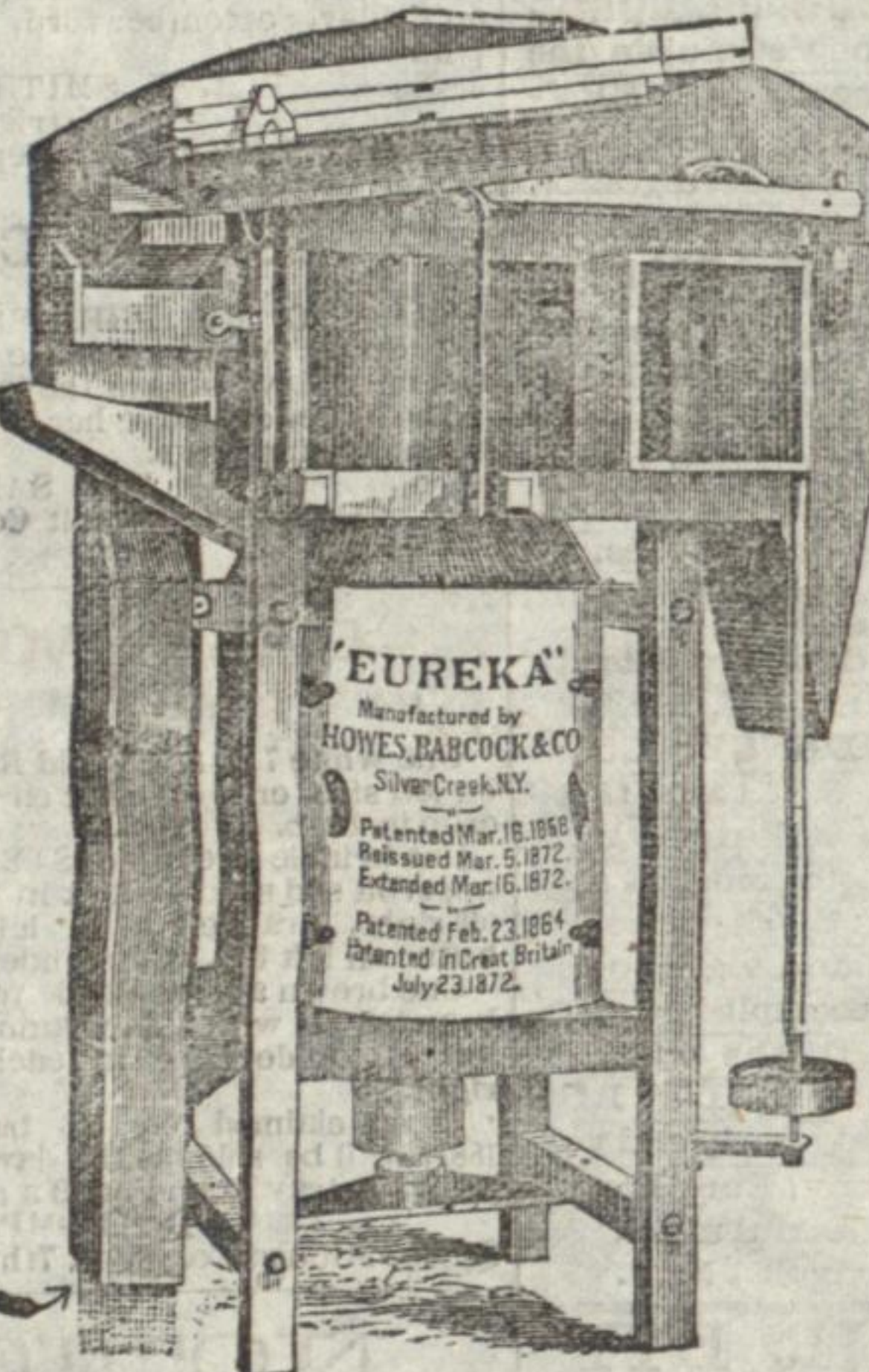
