Fourth District Court.

The Fourth district court commenced its judicial trial at 10 o'clock this morning, with a session of several weeks.

A number of accused persons are to be arraigned before the court, Judge Miller, to plead to charges preferred against them; while Oscar E. Hill, the wrecker of the Commercial bank, and others who have been indicted, are called in question before the bar as to the date of their trial.

Cheryl Stephens, a young woman of Warren W. Carey, Anne B. Carey, Charles J. Carey, W. H. White and J. O. White have been sued by Mrs. Ellsworth. Her claim is for the sum of \$10,000, which she alleges to be due her by the Carey family. The amount is secured by a mortgage on the Carey property, which she claims to be worth \$10,000. The Carey family, however, claims that the property is worth only \$5,000, and that the Carey family is not liable for the amount claimed by Mrs. Ellsworth.

In the suit of E. Ellsworth vs. Ogden city, wherein the plaintiff obtained judgment in the sum of \$10,000, during a former term of court, Judge Miller, given judgment for the defendant, and ordered that an appeal be taken to the Supreme court of the Territory. The appeal was taken, and the case is now before the Supreme court. The plaintiff, however, claims that the judgment of the district court is correct, and that the appeal was taken for the purpose of delaying the trial of the case.

The Brown Will.

Today was the time set for hearing the petition of Mrs. Brown, in which she asks to be appointed administratrix of the estate of her husband, John Brown, deceased.

A number of answers to Mrs. Brown's petition were filed, and the case is now before the court for its decision. The court is expected to grant the petition, and to appoint Mrs. Brown as administratrix of the estate of her husband.

Bound Over.

Deputy Marshal Smith has just returned from a trip to the Utah Valley. While there he arrested W. J. O'Connell of Loveland, who is charged with the murder of a woman named Mary O'Connell. The case is now before the court for its decision.

John Hildebrand, arrested on the charge of violating the police laws of the United States, was bound over to await the action of the grand jury under bonds of \$10,000, which he was unable to give. Deputy Smith brought him down to the penitentiary, where he now is.

Challenged to Shoot.

G. L. Becker, the present holder of the number's privilege, and holder of the Territory, has been challenged by James Anderson of Salt Lake City, to a duel. The challenge is on the ground that Becker has been guilty of a crime, and that he is therefore unworthy to hold the number's privilege.

The challenge is now before the court for its decision. The court is expected to grant the challenge, and to order a duel between Becker and Anderson.
