EASTERN DISPATCHES.

KEY WEST, Oct. 30.—The steamer Anna, which arrived this afternoon from Panama, brought intelligence of the burning of the Atlantic Mail Line S.S. Missouri, en route from New York to Havana. Of all on board only twelve are known to be saved. The captain and crew of the ill fated vessel are said to be among those who perished.

The Missouri was burning about 25 miles off Little Rock, P. O. Peace once more reigns in Pope County. The militia have been disbanded. Registration is quietly discontinued.

NEW YORK, Oct. 30.—H. J. Suijnn, Treasurer of the Atlantic Mail Line, furnishes the following dispatch:

"Nassau, via Key West, Oct. 29th.—The Missouri was burnt at sea, twenty-five miles from Abaco. Five of the crew and two passengers were lost. The survivors were saved. George Thackery, John Rihius, Enrique Yanez, Wilbur Tunnell, James Cutler, Emilie Quenbridge and Ebenezer Saunders (colored). There is but little hope of the rest of the crew and passengers. The steamer Anna, Key West, is waiting answer."

The above covers all the information the steamer Anna has given relative to the loss of the Missouri. I am sorry to say our agent first learned of the disaster from the passengers and drew saved, who doubtless landed at Nassau.

The dispatch was forwarded from Nassau to New York by telegraph. It is now known that the survivors are safe. The following is a list of passengers of the burnt steamer Missouri for Havana—

Greene, captain, John Brown, first officer, Lewis Farrell, second officer, Humpstead, purser, and a crew of 58 men.

CINCINNATI, Oct. 30.—General Garfield on Change to-day, said there was likely to be a raid made on Congress, demanding that Secretary Boutwell re-issue forty-four millions of greenbacks. He said the Secretary had no right to issue under the existing law. He said Congress looked to such bodies as this chamber for aid in their efforts against disturbing the currency.

NYC, Oct. 30.—Frank Cassidy, who has been closely confined in the Brooklyn police station for two months, and who was represented as one of a gang who murdered and kidnapped a woman, brought into court to-day by Captain Farn, anticipated a *heinous* corpus, and discharged, the captain not being able to prefer any charge whatever against the prisoner. Cassidy has disappeared, but previous to leaving he said Ferry asked him to be silent and he would give him money.

WESTERN DISPATCHES.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 30.—A movement is on foot here to run candidates at the election to fill the places of such officers whose terms were extended by the last legislature. It is the opinion of the movers that the action of the legislature is illegal, it is believed, that it is proper to elect at the coming election, and that whoever receives a majority of the votes cast will be entitled to the office. The movement is rather quiet. It has not come to the notice of any of the papers and is not in the interest of any political organization.

As a result the conflict between Lucy and Occident has been suspended, but much, but the crowd present was grand success. Various estimates place those present at from nine to eleven thousand. The true number would not vary much from ten thousand.

Hale & Co. have just completed the first submarine cable manufactured in this State. It is intended for use on the northern coast of this continent.

Two of the boys who were burned by the explosion of the gunpowder are considered to be in a critical condition.

An accidental fire at the German Hospital, Brannan St., this forenoon, caused damage to the extent of about \$1,500.

A Sacramento dispatch of this afternoon says the McLaughlin blunder of last night in the town talk to-day, to the exclusion of everything else.

The Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific directors also met and authorized an issue of ten millions of bonds.

NASHVILLE, Oct. 30.—The Democratic

State executive committee publish the result of the canvass as follows: Oberham, 77,075; Johnson, 40,026; Maynard, 49,500. The committee urges a concentration of vote on the party nominees to avert the election of three or four Republican Congressmen.

TROY, N.Y., Oct. 30.—Horse disease rapidly spreading.

NEW YORK, Oct. 30.—In the trial of Mayor Hall, Houghton, for the defense, occupied the entire time of court.

The pictures in the Governor's room which were seized to satisfy judgment against the city, have been released.

Judgment being affirmed.

The condition of the horses to-day in the cities reported little better.

There is nothing to indicate a speedy abatement of the disease. The progress of the disease in the fire department is most alarming. Out of one hundred and forty-four horses only two are well, and thirty-four horses are wholly unfit for use. Chief engine No. 100, which had a fire engine attached, with a propelling attachment, which can be run, is said, at the rate of a mile in three minutes, while its speed will be easily regulated. Six companies have been organized, in hand companies, with their ranks filled by details from others. All the old and worn-out carriages that could be found have been put into service and will be attached to the engines. Some of the tenders will be run by hand. Hundreds of longshoremen are complaining that the epidemic has rendered them penniless.

Most of these laborers work by the hour. Some have not been paid since the 1st of October.
