Weather in Case Past Week, and

The weather conditions during the week ending August 16th were generally favorable in most sections of the State for the growth, cultivation and harvesting of crops. The high temperature during the first part of the week was followed on the 12th by gales and refreshing showers which stimulated the growth of corn, potatoes, sugar-beets and other late crops, and assisted very materially in killing out some of the late grain. On the morning of the 14th light rain and gales continued, and on the 15th did much good toward killing off the growing grain. Middle of week very warm, mostly going up to 80 degrees. No gales, when cool, and on the 17th the weather was very warm, with no moisture. A little white frost in the morn., minimum temperature 40 degrees.
