

NEW PAVEMENT FOR MAIN STREET

City Council Orders Surfacing of Principal Thoroughfare And Calls for Bids.

IMPROVEMENTS SCHEDULED.

Entire Burden of Paying for Sidewalk Extensions Placed on the Shoulders of Property Owners.

Without even a squabble the city council last night passed a resolution presented by Councilman Black ordering the repaving and resurfacing of Main street from South Temple to South South street. The city recorder was ordered to advertise for bids for a period of 30 days and then the tenders will be opened. It is possible that work on the improvement will begin on May 19, and that it will be finished before the Grand Army encampment, in August.

There was only one protest against the improvement, that of Joseph Baumgarten who has 13.33 feet. The total estimated cost is \$46,064.51. This is divided as follows: "Bidders' portion," \$23,109.24 and city's portion \$22,955.27. The cost of a linear foot is \$3,484.47. The improvement includes the resurfacing and guttering of the street.

The council also ordered in the neighborhood of 35 blocks of new water mains which will cost approximately \$37,000.00. The board of public works was authorized to advertise for bids for the following extensions and dead head connections:

- On Fifth South and Third West streets, 16-inch pipe, 346 ft.
- Fifth South, Third West to Eighth West, 12-inch pipe, 1,111 ft.
- Third West, Fifth South to South Temple, 10-inch pipe, 9,143 ft.
- To connect dead ends and promote good circulation:
- Pierpont street, 270 feet east of Ninth West, 14.66 ft.
- Third South, Post street to Ninth West, 14.66 ft.
- Post street, 570 feet south of Fourth South, 14.66 ft.
- Fourth South, Seventh West to Eighth West, 14.66 ft.
- Fourth West, to connect dead ends north and south from Sixth South, 97.54 ft.
- Seventh West, from Pacific avenue to Fifth South, 478.72 ft.
- Seventh West, from Pierpont street to Third South, 14.66 ft.
- Eighth South, from Jefferson to Washington, 14.66 ft.
- Post street, from Third South to Fourth South, 14.66 ft.
- Water main on West Temple, from Fifth to Ninth South, before street is paved, 14.66 ft.
- Third South, from West Temple to Third West, 14.66 ft.

SPECIAL TAX WARRANTS.

The ordinances which make the special tax warrants conform to the new law were passed last night. In default of any one installment, these ordinances made the entire assessment due and the property can be sold by the city under a foreclosure. These ordinances placed the entire burden of paying sidewalk extensions on the property owners. For this reason the two big sidewalk extensions were postponed until after May 12 when this law goes into effect. The extensions are Nos. 126 and 128. It will reduce the city's share of the expense about \$12,000. The improvements have been selected in view of

EFFORT TO PULL HULK OFF SHOALS

Strenuous Exertions by the Old Mariners of "American" Party To Refloat the Ship.

ANDREW JACK WEBER AT HELM

District Chairman Piped on Deck to Assemble in the City Hall This Evening.

Strenuous exertions are to be made by some of the "old guard" who have picked the persimmons growing on the so-called "American" party tree for its three years ago, to save the old hulk from complete engulfment in the surf of adverse public opinion. A meeting of the district chairman of the relief has been called to meet in the office of the judge in the old city hall this evening, for the purpose of devising some means of keeping the remnant of the party together long enough to put up some kind of an excuse for its failure to carry out its campaign.

The "American" party is in a sad plight. With dissensions innumerable in its own ranks; with a bankrupt city treasury as the result of its administration starting in the face; with absolutely no excuse for carrying on its fight in the city except that of seizing the spoils of partisanship engendered by the iron rule of its leaders in the last two city campaigns by which any applicant for any municipal position, no matter how inconsequential, must show a record endorsed by his district chairman as being an "American" party man, or no job, it has come to the point where lovers of fair play have become disgusted and are waiting only for the time to come to express their disgust at the ballot box.

BREAKERS AHEAD.

It is said that Judge Andrew Jackson Weber has been selected to man the helm in the coming campaign; it is also said that Judge Weber has consented to do so, providing certain conditions are complied with as to money guarantees, etc. It is believed that the campaign will be further complicated by the desire of some of the rank and file of the party to endorse the course of Mayor Bradford, although Mayor Bradford was, on the dictum of Sefti, Lippman et al., read out of the party long ago; also that some considerable trouble will be encountered by the deep, dark, dank disunion into which Comedian Tom Black and Councilman L. D. Martin have fallen with the "rule or ruin" faction of the party, and that last but not least, an uprising of no mean consequence is scheduled to take place unless one "Jaks" Raleigh of cobblestone fame is not placed among the "also rans" of the party.

With these few shreds standing in the way of clear sailing into the harbor of victory in the coming fall campaign, the meeting of district chairmen of the "American" party called for tonight is not likely to prove a love feast.

BULLETIN ON COAL RATE COMPARISONS

Board Leaves for Cache to Investigate Some Needed Changes at Big Institution for Farmers.

The board of trustees of the Agricultural college plan to go to Logan this afternoon, to decide on the improvements, changes and repairs that are to be made in and around the college this summer. John C. Sharp, who is a member of the board, feels that the livestock question should be gone into thoroughly in the effort to have none but the best money can buy. President Lorenzo Stohl is of the same opinion. Mr. Sharp said this morning that he would not care to be connected with an institution like the college if the stock is no better than is to be found on the farm.

The fact that the college does not take any prizes at the state fairs, shows, said Mr. Sharp, "that something is wrong. This must be remedied, and we must have the best obtainable." Mr. Stohl said the board will clean up everything that is not thoroughbred, and it is understood that there are quite a few of the animals, except some horses, which are not pedigree.

MAIL CLERK ARRESTED FOR RIFLING LETTERS

Ren Sailor of Salt Lake Behind the Bars—Caught by Means Of a Decey.

Ren Sailor, a young man 30 years of age, who resides at 724 west North Temple street with his wife and three children, was arraigned before United States Commissioner Charles Baldwin yesterday afternoon on the charge of rifling registered mail packages on the train running between Salt Lake City and Malad, Idaho. His bonds were fixed at \$2,000, in default of which he was taken to the county jail, where he will have to remain to await the action of the grand jury, if bail is not forthcoming.

Sailor was arrested earlier in the day at Ogden by inspectors McKee, Lowe and Nelson, who caught him with the goods. They had sent three decoy packages of registered mail containing money to Sears, Roebuck company, Chicago; National Cash Register, New York, and Montgomery Ward & Company, all of them being mailed at Ogden. When the packages arrived, Ogden inspectors examined the packages sent by them, the currency in which had previously been marked, and they found that the money had been abstracted. Sailor was immediately placed under arrest, and the money was found on him. He made no attempt to deny the crime, but freely confessed that he had opened a number of letters and taken money from them, though he does not admit having taken the amount which is estimated to have been lost during the past nine or ten months. The inspectors say that during that time, as near as they can tell, several hundred dollars have been taken, but they put the amount stolen by him at less than \$100.

Sailor has been in the mail service on the railway for several years, but has only been on the Malad run for about eight months. During that time a great many complaints of losses on that division have reached the postoffice officials, and the inspectors were quick to set to work on the case. They soon gathered evidence that pointed to Sailor as the guilty one, but were not able to fasten the guilt upon him until they adopted the above ruse.

The offense is similar to that of C. E. Slade, the only difference being that Slade did his work in the postoffice, while Sailor opened his letters in the railway car.

Sailor is said to have offered the excuse for his acts that he was hard pressed for money owing to sickness in the home. His wife was nearly prostrated when the news reached her.
