### FURNITURE BY THE FOOT.

That's How it Was Sold to the Keystone State-Sofas on This Basis Are Worth \$1,182.20.

Harrisburg, Pa., Feb. 17 .- The trial capitol conspicacy case was of the resumed today. Following the precedent of his associates in their opening speeches for the defense, counsel former Supt. of Grounds Shumaker laid all responsibility for alleged irregularities in connection with the furnishings of the capitol upon Joseph M. Hueston, the archi-

npon Joseph M. Hueston, the archi-tect, Following the argument, the defense began calling experts to re-fute the testimory of the common-wealth that the measurements were falsified. Former Gov, Pennyaacker, is to be called as soon as Sanderson's experts have been heard. John Kauffman of Philadelphia, a designer of furniture, who was in the employ of Sanderson when the Jat-ter was given the contract for capi-tol furnishings, testified to the meas-urements of the 65 sofas meniloned in the indictment, for the purpose of showing that Sauderson did n.t. charge for as many "feet" as he might have under his contract. charge for as many "feet" as might have under his contract.

### DIDN'T GO THE LIMIT.

According to Kauffman's testimony According to Kauffman's testimony, a sofa for which Sanderson charged the state \$358.40, as containing 21 feet, actually measured 64 ¼ "surface feet" and could have been billed at \$1,182.20. A table measuring 2 feet 6 inches long and 2 feet 6 inches while, for which Sanderson charged the state \$64.40, according to Kauff-man's statement, contained 23 "sur-face feet" and should have cost the state \$423.20. Sanderson furnished the state clothes trees at \$37.60 each.

face feet" and should have cost the state \$423.20. Sandersen furnished the state clothest-trees at \$37.60 each, as containing 1½ feet. The revised measurements made by Kauffman show each tree to contain \$12 "sur-face feet" and each should have cost the state \$156.40. Kauffman said the 65 sofas, 30 ob-long tables, 24 oval tables, 50 round tables, seven square tables and 14 with clothestrees, mentioned in the indictment, measured 12,490 separe feet. At the various "per feet price" charged, Sanderson could have col-lected \$126,631.55, according to the witness. Sanderson charged the state \$49,417.89.

witness. Sanderson charged the state \$49,417.86. Mr. Kaufiman said the famous footblack stand in the senate lava-tory, for which the state paid Sander-son \$1.619.20, measured 64 % square feet. Sanderson sold this stand to the state at the rate of \$18.49 "per foot."

According to Kauffman's measure-ment, the contractor should have collected \$1,186.80 instead of \$1.-619.20. The state charges that San-derson pair a sub-contractor only \$125 for the stand.

### LODGE AMENDS SUBSIDY BILL.

Washington, Feb. 17.—An amend-ment to the mail subsidy bill was in-troduced in the senate today by Mr. Lodge, which authorized the postmas-ter-general to contract for carrying ocean mail in vessels of the third class and pay a subsidy of \$2 per outward mile on voyages of 4.000 miles or more. The bill also passed the senate al-lowing subsides to vessels of the first and second class.

The paper adduces as "convincing proof" that the officers of the Maine at-tended the functal of the victims in full dress uniform, which showed that they must have sent their uniforms ashore "in anticipation of an explosion." and alleges that the reason the wreck ahs not heen raised is that it would conclusively dem-onstrate that the explosion was in the magazine.
