



THE TAX PAYERS of G. S. L. county are hereby notified that their Territorial and County Taxes for the year 1859 are now due, and if not paid before the first day of September next, as the law directs, ten per cent. will be added to the amount then due and unpaid, to dewanted. fray the additional expenses of collecting, agreeable to section 2 of chapter 98, page 299 revised laws of Utah, which reads as follows: "It shall be the duty of every person owing taxes to pay the same at the office of the Assessor and Collector, by the first day of September, or sooner if required by the Collector; and for a failure to do so, shall be liable to pay ten per cent, on the amount of tax due, or a higher per cent. at the discretion of the County Court."
