

**ACCIDENT.**—A correspondent "A. T.," writes from Provo City, August 16th, requesting us to publish the following as a warning to parents—

"On Wednesday evening, the 14th inst., the infant son of Aguilera and Elmira Collins, residing in the 3rd Ward of this city, aged 13 months, came to his death under the following circumstances. The mother, in preparing the evening meal, placed a tin cup near the edge of the table, containing not to exceed one pint and a half of boiling tea, which she had just taken from the stove. She left the room for a moment, when the child toddled up to the table and in endeavoring to reach the cup upset the contents into his face and bosom, some entering his mouth. Having woolen clothing on he was severely scalded about the breast. Everything was done for his relief by the sorrow-stricken parents, but death put an end to the severe sufferings of the child some 24 hours after the accident."

Also at Parowan, August 14th, 1872, LYDIA, widow of the late Robert Munford, aged 71 years, 3 months and 2 days.

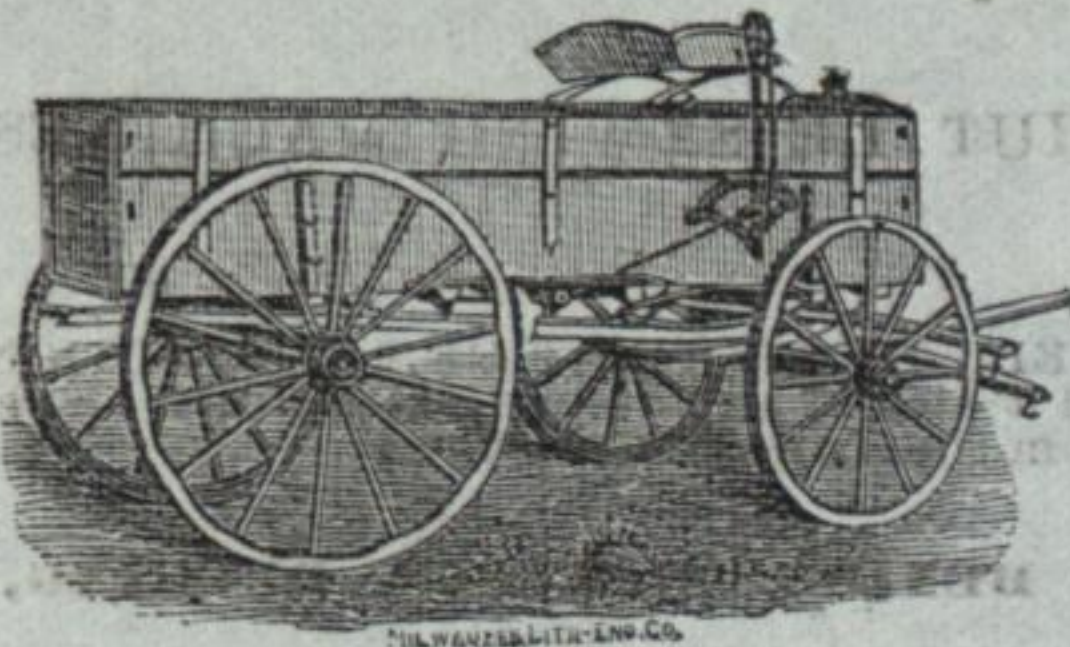

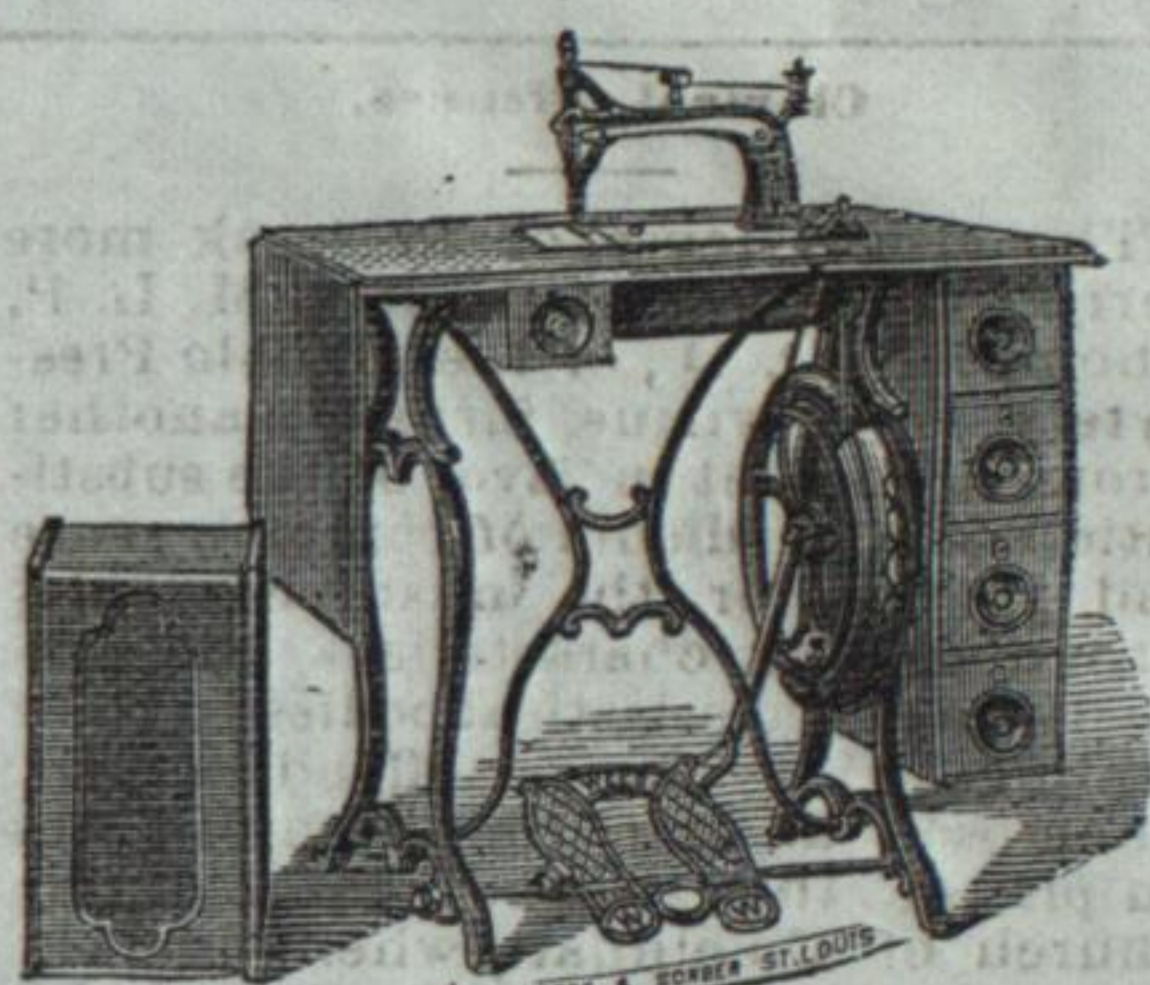
