

PULLIAM'S SCHEME FOR NEW RULES.

President of National League Believes He Has the Right One.

CAME TO BE NICE AND QUIET.

Players Will Not Dare to Think Evil Things of the Umpire—How Fine Will he be imposed.

It is announced semi-officially that President Pulliam is arranging a new set of rules for the government of ball players on the field, and that when they go into effect it will be impossible for a player to even think disrepectfully of an umpire without the official knowing the player's thought and thus be able to impose the proper penalty, says Mat in the New York Globe.

Each umpire is to be furnished with one of the noted thought transference dials, and all the umpire has to do is to glance at the dial and it will register the utmost thoughts of the most disrepectful players, said Mat. Therefore, he said that the president of the league is not only determined to suppress all outburst demonstrations against the umpires, but he is also set on preventing any mental reservations by the players.

For example, a player has three strikes called on him and goes to the bench with a scowl on his face. He makes an audible comment, and sees that the department is exceedingly busy. He glances at the dial and sees that the player is saying to himself:

"I wonder if I can't get that matron out of this kissin'! What a freak wouldn't know a strike if it hit him in the eye in broad daylight. I couldn't have reached any one, but I wonder if I can't get that matron out of this kissin'!"

"It will cost you \$10," say the umpire with a cold smile.

"I wasn't sayin' nuthin'," complains the player.

"I am aware that you didn't make any comments that could be heard, but I happen to know what you were thinking about."

Thereupon the flabbergasted player sinks to the bench and becomes completely disengaged.

While the rules in their entirety have not yet been made public, in substance the most important ones are as follows:

1. Disrespectful thoughts with red face and scowl, \$10.

2. Disrespectful impatience, with threatening glance, \$5.

3. Pale, set face, with biting of the lips, and mentally consigning the umpire to the flames, \$5.

Throwing the bat violently to the earth, growing purple in the face and muttering indistinguishable threats, \$15.

Looking at the umpire and with a sardonic smile on the face, \$10.

6. Pounding the home plate with the bat when a strike has been called, \$5.

Indulging in a wild dance with the ball two feet away from the plate, \$5.

8. Sitting on the bench and indulging in profanity under the breath, in which the name of a man's country is used.

These are the various new rules, and when they are in force Mr. Pulliam believes that the national game will be perfect, and almost as innocuous as a tourney of Old Maid, with ice a tourney as the stakes.
