CONGRESSIONAL.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 19.—Frelinghuysen

gave notice that he would to-

morrow ask the Senate to take up

the bill reported from the Judiciary

committee relating to Utah af-

airs.

Union introduced a bill author-

izing the President to appoint three

commissioners to revise the bank-

rupt law and report on the amend-

ments thereto. Offered by the Ju-

diary committee.

The two percent bill was taken

up, on a vote of 29 to 21, and de-

ferred to the committee on the

Asiatic Cable Telegraph bill.

Stewart, from the Committee on

the Pacific R. R., reported with

amendments the bill supplemental

to the bill incorporating the Texas

Pacific R. R. Company. It author-

izes the company to consolidate

with or lease any R. R. in Texas or

California, connecting with the

main line, on such conditions as

may be prescribed by the laws of

those states, also to construct

branches from its main line north

to the state line of Nevada, south

to the Mexican boundary. One branch

north and one south to be con-

structed from the main line in each

of the territories, New Mexico and

Arizona.

WASHINGTON, 19.—In the House,

without disposing of the bill, the

committee at once rose, on motion

of Beatty, who wished a hearing

on the bill to give the Washing-

ton and Puget Sound routes the

reporting and publishing of the de-

libates to Murtogh, of the Washing-

ton Republican.

Beatty again moved the previous

question, seconded, 32 to 25.

The Senate bill for publishing the

congressional debates and the con-

ference report on the steamboat bill

of the Treasury to withhold pay-

ments from railroad companies on ac-

count of freight or transportation of

property made by the U. S.

The committee resolved, on a

close vote, to non-concur in Ed-

wards' amendment, authorizing

the Secretary of the Treasury to

withhold all money due to the Pa-

cific railroad.

One of the principal pleas in de-

fense of the bill will be the insan-

ity of the measure.

The bar association finally de-

cided it was impossible to do any-

thing in the matter of the charges

against David Dudley Field.

Major Hovey was written a

letter denouncing the proposed re-

charter, as its adoption would in-

augurate the worst system ever in-

stituted on the city.

Last evening a milk train ran in-

WASHINGTON, D. C., 19.—At the

sitting of the Judiciary committee

this morning, Frelinghuysen said a

resolution passed in the Senate

yesterday permitted proof of any al-

legations of corruption against Pom-

eroy, directly or indirectly, to his

friends. He then asked Horton

what course he would pursue. Hor-

ton said the defense should know

what the accusers charged before

the committee was constituted, and

asked that the other side submit a

written statement of their allega-

tions, with the names of witnesses.

In the Pomeroys investigation, to-

day, Frank B. Baker, member from

Kansas, testified that Judge Hor-

ton, counsel for Pomeroys, in the

investigation offered to pay his

campaign expenses to vote for Pom-

eroys, saying it was the interest

of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa

Fe railroad.

Simpson said the pending investi-

sent stage of some of his witnesses,

that it would be unjust to compel

him to make the statement required

by Horton at this time.
