There Was Not Much Activity in  
The Pit During Today's  
Early Sessions.

### BOSTON CON. IN DEMAND.

May Day Continues on the Dowa Grade  
—New York Weak—Closing  
Quotations and Sales.

The summer dullness seems to be on  
in the Mining Exchange. During the  
forenoon sessions a total of 12,043  
shares were transferred for which was  
paid \$2,619.75.

May Day and New York were the  
principal stocks sold, but both went at  
prices fully 50 per cent under the quo-  
tations of a month ago. For Consolidated  
Mercur, 50 cents was bid, while  
the stock was offered at 57½ cents, with  
no sales reported. Again the Daily  
stocks were not in demand; New York  
Bananza and Wabash being the only  
Park City stocks wanted. No United  
States stock was offered at \$25 per  
share, the bid for it while those were  
broken to take Boston Consolidated  
at \$5.40.

#### BUYS INTO GOLDFIELD.

Captain Delamar Gets Foothold in Gold  
Camp.

A deal was made yesterday and  
closed by Captain De Lamar, the well-  
known mining man, who he now  
owns a group of six claims lying 12  
miles to the east of Goldfield, says the  
Goldfield News. Assays from the sun-  
face of a ledge eight feet wide show  
silver to be free silvering ore from \$20 to  
\$50 in gold. The claims were bought  
from Thompson & Mathews, the con-  
sideration being \$10,000.

Manion, and other parties of Grand  
Junction, Colo. They had, for some  
reason, given up their property and turned  
out to the vein down an incline for  
over 100 feet, skimming the upper sur-  
face of the vein, in the ore of the above,

been directed to cross cut the vein,  
which is at least 30 feet thick.

## BOSTON CON. OUT WITH STATEMENT.

#### What the Copper Company Pro- poses to Do in Equipment Of Mines.

#### MEETING OF SHAREHOLDERS.

Called for June 16th—Capital Stock to  
Be Increased—An Immense  
Benza.

The management of the Boston Con-  
solidated Mining company has issued a  
circular to shareholders which, among  
other things, contains the following:

It is also proposed to build a rail-  
road from the mines of the millsite  
which has already been purchased by  
the company at Peckham Point, on Utaw  
lake, together with equipping the mines  
with steam shovels for extracting from  
5,000 to 10,000 tons daily.

The proposed issue of \$250,000 bonds  
is to be in the form of 10-year 6 per  
cent debentures, convertible into 125,000  
shares of the stock of the company at  
the option of the holder at any time  
within the life of the bonds, the com-  
pany reserving the privilege of re-  
deeming the bonds during the first five  
years at 105 upon giving six months  
notice to do so.

Mr. J. E. Bamberger says Seattle  
is to be the center of the new  
district. Many new buildings are going  
up, and the city seems to be very pros-  
perous indeed. Of course the Alaska  
Klondike business is opening up now,  
and that cuts quite a figure at this time.

"I made some inquiry as to the cost  
of transporting our ore down the coast from  
the mines of the Alaskan coast, and I  
find that it can be done at a cheap  
rate. The fact is, we are coming from the  
mines of several hundred miles to winter  
as far as delivery is concerned. The ore when  
facilities for milling them are supplied.

That we may make this property  
productive, we propose to erect a concentrat-  
ing mill of modern type, with electric power equipment, at  
a place where water is abundant and all  
other conditions conducive to eco-  
nomical concentration. I have care-  
fully examined the question and have  
visited many places and have finally  
concluded that the proper site for our  
concentrating mill is upon the banks of  
Utaw lake, a distance of about 31  
miles from the mine, the ore when  
milled will be transported to the mill  
in barges, the cost of which will be  
about \$100 per ton.

"Seattle people are looking for a big  
mining camp in the immediate vicinity of the  
Washington metropolis.

While Mr. Bamberger was greatly  
impressed with the coast city and its  
advantages, he is not ready to admit  
that it is greater than those of Salt Lake, and when it comes  
to climate the northwest does not he  
gin to compare with Utah.
