

PORTO RICANS FEEL VERY SORE

Republican Party Leader Says
Pres. Taft's Message is an
Insult to a Weak People.

FORESEES GREAT CONFLICTS.

Much of Complaint and Criticism is
Because No Discrimination is
Made Between Parties.

San Juan, P. R., May 12.—President Taft's message on Porto Rico excited comment, mostly of an unfavorable nature here today.

The president's attitude has caused great disappointment among politicians of all parties. Gov. Regos H. Post said the message undoubtedly would be disappointing to political circles, but he anticipated no trouble in the islands.

Dr. J. C. Barbera, leader of the Republican party, who is serving his third term in the executive council, said:

"The president's message has not surprised me; I expected it. It is unjust in treating all Porto Ricans alike. Necessarily, we shall all have to suffer the consequences of the errors committed by half a dozen politicians, who obtained their influence and prestige through open support of the Americans controlling the insular government. The Republicans, Labor party, independents and business men who have not any direct representation in the house of delegates, and who constitute the majority in the island, have been represented by a handful of men who are anti-American and who do not think or act as we do."

"The message," he said, "has caused a feeling of the most profound discontent. The speaker of the house of delegates has sent a cablegram direct to Congress in behalf of the house, and the Unionist party reserves to itself the adoption of resolutions depending upon the developments. We will remain still and await the legislation Congress chooses to pass."

"I foresee greater conflicts for the future, terminating in complete rupture between the government and public opinion. The Unionists cannot be held responsible for it. They tried to prevent a clash, but could not. The president's message is an insult heaped upon a weak people that cannot reply."

Santiago Iglesias, organizer of the American Federation of Labor in Porto Rico, said:

"The message is a strong reproach generally, but it does not discriminate between the various classes. We the Unionists are solely responsible for the present condition of affairs. President Taft accuses the Republicans, Federalists, Socialists and neutrals, commending the large majority who have the slightest responsibility for the quarrel between the Unionists and the executive council. The organized laborers are dissatisfied with the message because they see retrogression. They believe Congress should not punish those who have had no hand in the crisis."

face-seeking and of radical newspapers in Manila," says the director, "are not to be taken as indicative of the sentiment of the mass of the Filipinos who above all things desire peace and a return of economic prosperity. Differences of religion seem to be losing their political importance. There are indications of the waning of the Aglipay cult and a return to its adherence to the old time faith. Protestant missionaries in nearly all provinces have gathered little flocks, actuated by one motive or another, but show no material increase. The Colorum, Guardia de Honor and Santa Iglesia, if these names mentioned among religious faiths, show no material change. Their membership is all fanatical, ready to follow or forsake their leaders, and the leadership of plausible but unscrupulous scoundrels who exploit the poor, ignorant and superstitious for pleasure or commercial profit."

JEFFERSON DAVIS' NAME ON CABIN JOHN'S BRIDGE

Washington, May 12.—By the end of the present week the name of Jefferson Davis will be chiseled into the stone in famous Cabin John's bridge, six miles west of this city.

ex-President Roosevelt having given instructions to this effect previous to his retirement.
As the bridge was built when Mr. Davis was secretary of war, his name was contained in the stone tablet in the structure, which is the aqueduct over which the District's water supply passes. During President Lincoln's administration and after Mr. Davis had become president of the confederacy, the latter's name was chiseled out by some staunch adherent of the Union.

INTERNATIONAL COMMERCE.

New Record for the World Was Established in 1907.

Washington, May 12.—A new record for the international commerce of the world was established in 1907, according to the statistical abstract of the United States, prepared by the bureau of statistics of the department of com-

merce and labor. This abstract puts the total exports of the various countries and colonies of the world in that year at 14 billion dollars, and the imports at 16 billion dollars. Of this grand total the United States is credited with 14.4 per cent of the imports and with 9.2 per cent of the exports. Ten countries contributed more than two-thirds of the total. On the export side the United Kingdom headed the list with \$2,072,000,000; the United States coming next with \$1,855,000,000; Germany next with \$1,623,000,000 and France fourth with \$1,080,000,000. On the imports side the United Kingdom headed the list with \$3,143,000,000; Germany second with \$2,082,000,000; France third with \$1,210,000,000 and the United States fourth with \$1,194,000,000. Practically two-thirds of this total of international trade is credited to Europe.

In the year under consideration, Canada took 58 per cent of her imports from the United States; Mexico 53 per cent, the Central American states more than 60 per cent, Cuba 49 per cent, Santo Domingo 53 per cent, Haiti 51 per cent, and the Dominican 21 per cent, Germany 15 per cent, Japan 17.8 per cent, and France 11 per cent.

U. S. OFFICIALS SAID TO HAVE ACCEPTED PASSES

Tallahassee, Fla., May 12.—Charges that many persons of prominence in Florida have accepted passes on the railroads, contrary to the law, have been submitted to the house by a committee appointed to investigate the pass files of the state railroad commission. The report was referred to the committee on judiciary.

Among those reported to have accepted passes are: United States Senator Tallahassee Representative Frank Clark, former Representative Robert W. Davis, A. C. Cron, state controller; W. T. Bauskett, secretary to Senator Tallahassee; United States Dist. Judge J. W. Locke; United States Dist. Judge Alexander Brownman.

While the anti-pass law of Florida does not affect federal officers in any way, it specifically provides punishment by fine or imprisonment for the giving by any railroad of passes to salaried employees of the state, any such officer accepting a pass being subjected to like penalties.

Chicago, May 12.—Abraham Merinbaum, the pardon clerk in Mayor Buess's office, is sounding a warning against the use of blue blotters. Danger of bloodpoisoning exists from the chemicals used in preparing them, he declares, and in support of his contention shows an infected finger which prevents his writing.

WOULD REMOVE TONSILS TO PREVENT TUBERCULOSIS

Chicago, May 12.—Wholesale cutting out of tonsils from the throats of every one subject to tuberculosis is advocated by physicians attending the fifty-fourth annual convention of the Illinois Homeopathic Medical association.

Tonsils clearly had no friends among the assembled physicians. One described them as "things good for microbes. Another declared that no use for them has ever been found and the agreement was general that their removal checked incipient tuberculosis. Twelve per cent of the children examined recently," said Dr. Richard H. Street, "were found infected with incipient tuberculosis. When the tonsils of these children were removed there was complete recovery."

Dr. Burton Hazeltine, secretary of the association, expressed his approval of this incident of tonsils. Dr. Hazeltine added that medical men have been unable to find a reason for the existence of tonsils and have decided that they are a "vestigial organ, like the appendix, of a lower form of life."

"It is probable," he continued, "that they had some use in some previous stage of animal life, but we are unable to discover what that use was."
