### Senator Daniels in Favor of Silver Currency.—House Affairs.

### WASHINGTON, May 22.—In the Senate the silver bill was taken up and Daniel addressed the Senate in favor of silver currency. His speech was a valuable analysis of silver currency down upon the United States in case of free exchange of silver. It was obvious, he said, that the country was in a position to produce more silver than it consumed, and it was also obvious that there was no such amount of production of silver as to cause a depreciation of its value. He said that there was only one other point of importance in the bill, and that was the question of whether or not the bill would allow an accumulation of silver to such an extent that it would have a tendency to raise the price of silver.

### SENEGAL DUTIES.

### LONDON, May 22.—In the Commons today the matter of the proposed reduction of duties in America on sugar below 16, Dutch standard, the government wants the Washington government to join the sugar convention.
