

MITCHELL HERO OF MINE WORKERS

When He Appeared in Their Convention Delegates Went Wild With Enthusiasm.

TALKED ON JAIL SENTENCE.

denied That Laboring Men Wished Special Privileges Under the Law.—A Message to Gompers.

Indianapolis, Jan. 22.—This was John Mitchell day in the convention of the United Mineworkers of America. When the former president of the miners appeared upon the stage of Tomlinson hall, the 1,300 delegates went wild with enthusiasm. Many delegates wept. Mr. Mitchell, who was deeply moved, said: "I feel keenly sensitive to the reception you have given me this day. It would seem that at least in a miners' convention a former leader of laboring people loses none of his lustre because he is sentenced to jail."

He was interrupted by another thunderous burst of applause. When the tumult subsided, Mr. Mitchell began a long speech, dealing with the sentence to jail imposed upon him, Samuel Gompers and Frank Morrison by Judge Wright of the District of Columbia.

Mr. Mitchell pictured what he considered the injustice of a system by which the "constitutional rights of free speech and a free press were denied," and by which men could be deprived of their liberty without trial by jury.

He denied that laboring men wish special privileges under the law, but declared that they do wish rights guaranteed by the Constitution to all men. He said the Wright decision only emphasized the need of legislation that will secure to every citizen the right of trial by jury before being sent to jail.

P. J. McLeister, a delegate, moved that a petition be prepared, addressed to President Roosevelt, and protesting against the Wright decision. This motion was adopted.

The convention voted \$2,500 for the defense of Messrs. Gompers, Mitchell and Morrison, and specified that further financial aid would be given if necessary.

Samuel Gompers sent the following message: "Please convey to the delegates fraternal greetings and best wishes for a most successful convention. Now is the time that tries men's souls. Now is the time to more thoroughly organize and solidify the ranks of labor. Stand true for justice and human freedom."

RAILROAD NEWS.

CHANGES ON ROCK ISLAND.

President Robert Mather Severs Connection With the Road.

Chicago, Jan. 22.—The Record-Herald today prints the following news articles:

Robert Mather, president of the Rock Island and Pacific Railroad company, and the Moore brothers, who control the Rock Island-Frisco properties, have decided to part company.

Mr. Mather, who has had his headquarters in New York for a number of years, has accepted the position of chairman of the board of Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing company, and as such, it is understood that he is to be in charge of the company's legal and financial affairs. In the east it is said that Mr. Mather was offered a tempting salary and decided to cover his relations with the Moores. In connection with the affair, however, is a rumor that the relations between the Moores and Mr. Mather have not been as pleasant recently as they might have been.

It is understood that his place as president of the two companies, which are the Security Holding companies for the Moore roads, will be filled by H. F. Yoakum, who now spends a large part of his time in New York. Mr. Mather is also general counsel for the Rock Island road. This position probably will be given to Richard A. Jackson, now first vice president and general solicitor. The position of general solicitor probably will be abolished. The retirement of Mr. Mather may also indicate that the Moores are going to revive their plan of separating the Rock Island and Frisco systems and changing their financial organizations.

VICE PRESIDENT PLEASED.

J. Ross Clark and Party Stop Over En Route to Los Angeles.

J. Ross Clark, vice president of the Salt Lake Road, spent a few hours in Salt Lake yesterday afternoon, leaving last night for Los Angeles. Mr. Clark was accompanied by his wife and daughter, Mrs. E. C. Lee, Mrs. W. A. Clark, Jr., and were joined at this point by W. A. Clark, Jr., who accompanied the party to Los Angeles. During the stop over, Clark kept up wonderfully well on the line, especially in the passenger department. People desiring to get away from the rigors of the eastern winter for the most part take the Salt Lake Route from this city to Los Angeles, and in the summer time the return travel is largely over the same line.

Mr. Clark stated that the freight business of southern California was exceptionally good this year, the total shipments of oranges for the season exceeding 2,400 cars.

Little Rock, Ark., Jan. 22.—The Zinc Belt Railroad company has filed articles proposing to build through the heart of the zinc belt in the northern tier of counties of the state, eventually extending from Little Rock to St. Louis, Mo. The capital stock is fixed at \$1,500,000.

SECOND TRACK BUILT.

The new double-tracked section of the main line is 30 miles in length, and the construction of the second track required more than a year's labor.

death certificates issued were for single persons, the number being 48. Among infants under 3 years of age only four deaths are recorded, while 13 is the number between 5 and 15 years.

During the month 105 houses and 567 persons were disinfecting, 334 rooms being treated for smallpox, 181 for scarlet fever and 45 for diphtheria.
