

## PROMPT RELIEF FOR THE SETTLERS

Editor Deseret News Dear Sir—In your issue of May 7, 1909, under the heading, "The Sun Shines Once More Upon the Reservation," you print an interview with Rock M. Pope of Theodora, Utah, which does an injustice to the people of this community.

If the gentleman was correctly quoted, we desire to place before him and

the people of the state generally, a few facts and leave it to a candid public to judge whether the people of Vernal are as bad, as was set forth in the interview.

In the outset, we want to say that the people of Vernal have never looked upon the reservation settlers as objects of charity. They have been and are our neighbors, and we have looked upon them as such. True they are and have been braving the hardships of pioneer life and are meeting with the vicissitudes incident to the building up of a new country, but they are doing it with a fortitude worthy of a pioneer spirit.

When it became evident during the winter, that there might be some cases of need before the advent of spring, a committee was appointed by the stake presidency of the Utah stake to re-

ceive contributions and assist in their distribution. A call was then made on the bishops of the various wards and the Relief societies to collect means, food and clothing for those in need on the reservation, and be it said here that this matter was not confined to any church, but citizens irrespective of creed or party gave liberally of their means at hand, and inasmuch as the Latter-day Saints authorities were first in the field in this good work, and had organizations for this distribution, to them was given the work of distributing.

While Relief societies and individuals have contributed liberally it is impossible to determine accurately just how much has passed from this community to needy ones on the reservation, but from the figures at hand it may conservatively be stated that besides the

cash not less than 10,000 pounds of flour; 800 pounds of honey; 4,000 pounds of bran and chop feed; 5,000 pounds of baled hay, and other forage and food stuffs in like or greater proportion have been distributed.

Since Jan. 15, not on one but on many occasions, teams loaded with gratuitous contributions have been sent from this point, to distribute supplies, and in many instances where it was impracticable to send hay, teams were brought from that section and fed without charge in this valley.

While it is true that the price of hay and grain have advanced to a considerable extent, it is due to the unusually hard and long winter and is the natural result of the law of supply and demand, which unfortunately the citizens of Vernal have no more control over, than have the citizens of

Salt Lake City.

The purpose of this article is not to breed our charity, but to correct wrong impressions that may have been created; we have done by our neighbors, as we would wish to be done by. We believe our efforts in this direction have been appreciated.

Does it appear reasonable that in a little community such as ours is, which within three days raised \$285.75 for the unfortunate victims of the Messina disaster, should allow our fellow neighbors to suffer for the necessities of life?
