

## JUBILEE SERVICES.

Impressive Ceremonies in the Churches of London.

## QUEEN VICTORIA IS ATTENDANT.

Special Hymns and Prayers—Virtues of the Queen a Glad-Cheer Service.

LONDON, June 20.—It was a quiet day with the entire life of Queen Victoria to have begun her jubilee before the stir of her empire that in front of which she kneels in ever closer touch with the past is the altar at Frogmore, the burial place of the prince consort and—to her of her majesty. Thus this morning at 11 o'clock the queen offered solemn thanksgiving to the Almighty.

The service was impressive. The four imposing bronze shields guarding the cumbent marble figure of Prince Albert were brightened by the sun-shine coming through the stained glass windows of the dome, casting shadows on the robes of the vestments and chalice and the lamp-flames and gold, and then falling on the figures of Princesses Alice and Victoria.

The service was simple. There was no sign of scarlet and gold effulgence which is typical of the coming week. The queen's robes accented by the red and white of Wales, the Empress Frederick, Princess Charlotte, the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge, the Princess Louise, Princess Mary, the Princess Royal, the Duchess of Albany, the Duke and Duchess of York, the Duchess of Fife, Princess Charles of Denmark and Princess Victoria of Wales.

The Right Rev. Lord Bishop of Winchester, assisted by the Rev. C. F. Eliot, dean of Windsor, presided. The ordinary morning prayers began with a short exhortation from First Timothy and the psalm of David, and the credal concluded this scene.

Priest—O Lord, save the queen.  
Answer—Who putteth her trust in Thee.

Priest—Send her help from Thy holy angels.

Answer—And evermore mightily defend her.

Priest—Let her enemies have no advantage over her.

Answer—And smite not the wicked, approach to hurt her.

After the first collect this special collect was read:

"O Lord, which providest for Thy people以色列人, who have given them to us, grant unto thy servant, our queen, the spirit of wisdom and government, that being endowed unto Thee with all her heart, she may so rule over thy kingdom, that in its time the chosen of God in Israel and Christians' devotion may continue in peace; and on persevering in good works unto the end, she may by Thy grace be admitted to thy Kingdom through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, who liveth and reigneth ever with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end."

Instead of the usual prayer for the queen and royal family two special prayers were substituted.

A special prayer for unity was used and this was succeeded by the usual offering of the bread of the day, the gospeling the well-known sixteenth verse of the twenty-second chapter of St. Matthew, "Blessed are the peacemakers."

The services were conducted by the Right Reverend William Walsham How, Lord Bishop of Wakefield, set to music by Mr. G. A. Smith. The singing was strong and clear, the hymns well selected. The second and third verses ended to the organ.

For every heart made glad by Thee,

With cheerful praise we swelling;

And happy souls are being.

The last hymn consisted of three stanzas.

"He then has done for us many things,

With sixty years of blessing.

Royal hearts, with wide anchores

And many seals, such mother grace,

Were satisfied to be under his shelter,

All thys wrongs bearing,

For man's best service doing.

Immediately after the general

service, the organist, Mr. G. A. Smith, gave a short recital.

ERTHQUAKE SHOCKS.

Los Angeles, Calif., June 21.—Shortly after noon today the most severe earthquake shock since 1850 did many thousand dollars damage to buildings and the surrounding country. The shock occurred in several narrow canyons and was suppressed here. Many ambulances with wounded have arrived here.

The shocks are concentrating around Hawaiki. Two hundred men were drawn into the hospital, mostly men. They fought bravely, but were compelled to retire.

The shock was so violent and appears inconstant to his fate. He will surely be shot unless strong action is taken by the United States.

Shocks and Clusters.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., June 21.—Heavy shocks in Tennessee, southern Virginia and western North Carolina indicate severe storms Saturday night and Sunday.
