Washington, D. C., Feb. 1.—
[Purples]—The day will wind up
with either a noble's victory or
defeat. The House will be in session
tomorrow evening, and the speaker
will be called upon to vote for the
closing debate.

The Capitol was thronged as early
as 10 o'clock and the gallery corridors
were crowded before eleven, and after
the House was prohibited by the
Capitol police.

The floor of the House was packed
with members new and old. The side
aisle was that of an amphitheater;
and the sides were black with
seated beings, intent upon the glori-
fied conflict between the champions
of the House. At 12 o'clock the com-
mittee arose and reported the tariff bill
with minor amendments to the House.

Speaker Reed took the floor and
delivered his speech.

The American people had chosen their
representatives at the polls, and the
