

IT WAS FRAUD!

Utah Commission's Statement in Open Court.

BOXES TAMPERED WITH

Known to the Commission or Its Employees.

CERTIFICATES WILL BE ISSUED

On Reprehensible Delinquency in Receipts—And the Commission Hopes to End the Fraud, They Would Not Oppose the Matter.

There was considerable of a sensation in the Third district court this afternoon, upon a statement presented by Judge J. W. Fowles, as counsel for the Utah Commission, in which it is practically admitted that they are convinced that there has been fraud committed in connection with the Hapke county ballot boxes. These were tampered with unknown to the Commission or to any of its employees, and the revelations in court were a complete surprise to the Commission. Had that body suspected anything of the kind, the boxes would not have been opened by them, and now that they have discovered the fraud, they come out in a plain, straightforward, square statement, announcing their intention of issuing the certificates to the persons whom the returns from the judges of election show to have been elected.

Whatever fraud has been committed was without the connivance of the Utah Commission, which is by this action fully vindicated and cleared of any taint of suspicion. The statement by Judge Fowles was as follows:
