

TWO MEN WILL GO TO INVESTIGATE

Lehi Beet Raisers Considering Colorado Company's Proposition.

LANDS IN GRAND VALLEY

Will Probably Be Settled by Utah Farmers—Utah Company's Plan to Be Enlarged.

Lehi, Jan. 31.—At the Central school house last evening about fifty citizens met to listen to the proposition made by Manager Cox of the Colorado Sugar company with reference to inducing Utah beet growers to go to Colorado and instruct the farmers there in the art of raising sugar beets. He made a detailed explanation of the land and climate, as to their adaptability to the growing of beets. It was unanimously decided to send two persons down to examine the land, etc., as representatives for those who were selected. Mr. Cox stated that the Colorado Sugar company would pay the expense of one of these men and a subscription was taken in the meeting, where sufficient money was raised to cover the expense of sending the other. Quite a number of the farmers here are much interested in the proposition, and undoubtedly a considerable number from here will move into Grand Valley, Colo., the coming spring.

Mr. C. S. Gillman, construction engineer of the firm E. H. Dyer & Co., arrived here this morning. Mr. Gillman will supervise the enlargement of the Utah Sugar company plant, under the direction of M. W. Ingalls, the company's local engineer.

The people of this ward are much interested over the contemplation of a new meeting house. Already most of the rock for the foundation has been promised.

LIVELY RUNAWAY.

P. C. Jensen of Lake Shore, Narrowly Escapes Being Killed.

P. C. Jensen, a resident of Lake Shore, on the border of Utah Lake, miraculously escaped being killed this afternoon. He was driving a team hitched to a wagon down State street and immediately after passing the Knutsford hotel one of the horses shied at a passing street car and commenced kicking like fury. Jensen was perched on a bale of hay and tugged at the lines in a vain attempt to control the infuriated beast. Pretty soon the other horse became obstreperous and the next thing seen of the outfit was as it started down the street at a 24 mile rate. Near the intersection of State and Fourth South streets the runaway came in contact with the telephone poles in the center of the street. It was plain to everyone that Jensen could not avoid the poles and pedestrians expected to see the man dashed to pieces. Fortunately he came out of the wreck without as much as a scratch, but badly frightened. A number of willing hands were ready to give Jensen assistance and when last seen the prospect was favorable for him to resume his journey.

ELDERLY WOMAN INSANE.

Mrs. Julia S. Kohlman, a Widow 79 Years Old, Sent to Poor House.

Mrs. Julia S. Kohlman, a widow, who has been living with friends at 579 Fifth street, was examined as to her sanity today and ordered sent to the county infirmary. The woman is 79 years old and a native of Sweden. She came to Utah in 1852, and so far as known has no relatives in this country. Her occupation has been that of a housewife, but for some time past she has been cared for by charitable organizations. Her class of insanity is senile dementia. She has very excited ideas of herself, and is totally irresponsible. She has manifested no disposition to injure others, but has repeatedly threatened to kill herself when interfered with.

The examination was conducted before County Physician H. A. Anderson, and Dr. Charles P. Wilcox, with County Clerk Dunbar sitting as judge, pro tem.

The old lady's condition was such that it was thought better not to send her to the asylum, and she was accordingly ordered sent to the infirmary.

PLANS OF GROESBECK CO.

Capital Stock to be Increased One Hundred Thousand Dollars.

Most of the Money Will be Used in Improving the Kenyon and Wasatch Blocks.

The Groesbeck company has decided to increase its capital stock from \$150,000 to \$250,000, its holdings and strong financial condition fully warranting this step.

It is understood that the additional capital will be largely used in making extensive improvements at the Kenyon hotel and Wasatch block properties.

The present stockholders will have the first chance at the new stock, and it is not likely that much of it will find its way into the market.

AN ABSORPTION.

Cosgriff-Enright Company Takes in Hanson Produce Company.

Today the Cosgriff-Enright company purchased a controlling interest in the Hanson Produce company of this city. The new firm occupies the fine Henderson warehouse building located on the corner of Second South and Third West streets, where a big wholesale business is conducted. For the present the Hanson business will proceed about as heretofore and under the same management.

The purchasers, who came from Wyoming a short time ago, declined to give the amount of money involved in the deal, but it is understood to have reached a pretty stiff figure.

BANKRUPTCY CASES.

George Romney, Jr., has filed a petition in the Jerome Hirschman bankruptcy case, asking that goods from Hirschman's stock to the value of \$1,000 be set apart for petitioner, in addition to the regular claim of \$500. Mr. Romney asserts that credit for that amount was obtained by Hirschman through misrepresentation as to his financial condition. Judge Marshall will pass upon the petition.

J. Fred Wey has filed his application for final discharge. He put in his petition in bankruptcy in December last.

The first meeting of the creditors of Erick Brown has been set for February 10, when a receiver will probably be appointed.

SCHOOL BOARD IS CONSIDERING

Influences at Work Against the Protracted Vaccination Vacation.

MAY OPEN SCHOOLS MONDAY

Recognized That Continued Shut Down Will Work Irreparable Injury to Educational Interests.

There were evidences today of the school board receding from its indicated intentions to continue an indefinite shut-down of the public schools in accordance with the request of the board of health. The reason for the expected modification is found in the fact that very strong influences are being brought to bear against both boards in the hope that disaster to the schools may be averted. It is recognized and admitted that a much further postponement of the opening of school will result in a body blow being delivered to the school interests of the city so far as this year is concerned. Principals and teachers declare that should the vacation be extended for another three weeks or a month, that the beneficial results cannot be overcome this year; that pupils who graduate will be poorly equipped or that their graduation or promotion as the case may be will be delayed for another year—a condition that will blight the prospects of many students. It is a well known fact that there are many students both in the High School and eighth grades who must graduate this year or not at all as they cannot afford to go to school any longer; and in order to get through successfully they must have every hour of time that they can. To deny them that time many of the principals and teachers say is placing a stumbling block in the way of their mental and material progress when no real reason therefor exists.

The board of education will meet tomorrow night and it is quite certain that some understanding will be had before that time that will permit of the opening of the schools on Monday next.

NO MORE ESCAPES.

The State prison now has a perfect electric alarm system and hereafter it will be extremely difficult for any convict to make his escape by the wall route. The arrangement, which was only completed yesterday, consists of a wire placed around the top of the building and connected with numerous alarms. The wire is arranged so that if a rope or blanket is thrown across the wall an alarm will be instantly given.
