This is a material addition eign government to the population by that source, the place. being at the rate of about two per cent to the whole population, or at about the rate of \$90,600 persons for the whole country. We are safe enough in asserting that no other Territory or Pacific State, and probably no western State can and probably no western State can make any such showing.

This good work for Utah has been accomplished mainly through the self-sacrificing labors and devotion ernment of the people of the Territory. In-deed many of the emigrants have ed loan. been brought wholly or partially by means of cash sent for the purpose by the people residing here.
