

# STATUE OF PAUL REVERE

Unveiling Ceremony of Beautiful Piece Takes Place at Forest School.

A statue of Paul Revere was yesterday unveiled at the Forest Dale school, and appropriate exercises were held to celebrate the event. The movement for erecting the statue was begun in the school several weeks ago, and through

contributions from the pupils and teachers this beautiful piece of statuary representing "Paul Revere's Ride" was arranged for. The piece is by C. E. Dallin, Utah's noted sculptor, and was executed by him in Boston. It cost between \$75 and \$80, and is accounted as one of Mr. Dallin's finest pieces of art. The exercises began at 2 o'clock, and were held under the supervision of Preston D. Richards, principal of the Forest Dale school. The following program was rendered on the occasion:

to destruction. The blaze was extinguished with a nominal loss. The machine belongs to Alonzo Hyde. Films in a moving picture machine at the Nickelodeon theater on Main street ignited about 10 o'clock and caused considerable excitement, although there was no stampede in the audience. No material loss was sustained. Another alarm came from the residence of F. C. Richmond, 1116 east South Temple street, where oil rags used by a chimney sweep caused a blaze. Firemen were quickly on the

scene and prevented the flames from destroying the place, which is valued at \$10,000. The damage amount to about \$200.
