PLACERS YIELD MUCH GOOD DIRT

Spring Will See Great Activity in Manhattan Mining District.

RUNS TWENTY CENTS A PAN.

Machinery is Being Installed and District Will Extend Over Many Miles of Country.

With the coming of spring the placer mines of Manhattan will cause one of the greatest rushes to that vicinity that will fairly startle the old state of Nevada. At present the workings are somewhat handicapped owing to the coldness of the weather, which causes the riffles in the sluice boxes to freeze, but when the weather in the north takes a change for the warmer times will begin to hum, says the Tonopah Bonanza. For over a distance of five miles the scene of placer operations extends, and already a few of the leases are installing pumps and whines. The original discovery was made at Central, about two and a half miles below Manhattan, and from there the territory extends for over three miles farther down the creek. One of the peculiar features of the ground is that there are two channels, a wet and a dry one. The water used for the sluicing comes from the wet channel.

The mines are being worked and operated principally by Manhattan people with one exception, that being "Dry Wash" Wilson of Round Mountain, who recently paid a fancy price for an interest in the Davis property. This sale was made after a few intricate disclosures were made, which resulted in values being received that went in the vicinity of \$5 to the pan.

ABOUT FIFTEEN LEASES.

In all there are about fifteen leases and properties being worked, and new leases are starting daily. It has been predicted by several prominent mining men that the placer workings will extend through the townsite and probably out to West Manhattan, and a few are of the opinion the pay dirt will eventually reach Peavine valley, a short distance of some 14 miles from Manhattan. Should this prove to be true the territory will equal the famous Klondike.

The Hayward, Auxler and Carey workings have reached bedrock at a depth of 47 feet and have run four shafts in different directions. In order to test the ground they sent about 20 cubic yards of dirt through the boxes, their shaft and workings are in a channel and a few days ago they installed a pump with which they keep the shaft free from water.

WASH RICH DIRT.

About ten days ago the Humphrey and Marten lease worked out 2,200 pounds of dirt that averaged \$25 a yard. When the report of this clean-up was circulated it caused considerable excitement in the town, and numerous offers were made for the lease, all of which were refused. The Stevenson and Maule lease encountered a five-foot body of pay dirt yesterday at a depth of 45 feet. Runnings were made from this body which resulted in from 15 to 20 colors to the pan. This body it is thought will average about \$20 to the yard. A whin has been installed on the property and when the dirt is extracted and placed on the dump.

TWENTY CENTS A PAN.

On the Jim Barney lease pay dirt was encountered at a depth of 30 feet, and two and one-half body of dirt was found from which 20 cents can be secured from a miner's pan. Al Hines is also working in the pay dirt and rich banches have been found in several places. These workings are somewhat handicapped owing to the amount of water encountered, which necessitates the installing of a pump, which will probably be in operation inside of the next two weeks.

Davis and Wilson will also install a pump and the work on their property will be rushed. They have secured in several places dirt that averages over \$5 to the pan and when everything is in shape they expect to make some startling clean-ups. A hoist for their property and shafts will also start sinking a new shaft, as too much water has been encountered in the old one when they struck the bedrock. Price and Waldman have installed a sluicing pump and are working on a good body of dirt.

SINKING FOR BED ROCK.

Charles Humphrey and Frank Maxson have just started work on a large body of ground, but have not reached the bedrock yet. They will install a complete equipment and when the bed rock is struck will rush the operations.

The bedrock is found throughout the district at about an average depth of 45 feet and the width of the channels run from 100 to 200 yards. Panings can be secured from the surface down, but the rich ground is found near the bedrock. Several dry workings have been in operation in Manhattan for some years, on the Little Grey ground, and excellent returns are being secured by them. MARKET BUSY WITH TINTICS.

Much Bullock and Tintic Combination Stock Bought on Exchange.

Indications that look good for the discovery of some good ore at both the Bullock and Tintic Combination mines in the East Tintic district caused a run on both stocks on the exchange this morning that sent the transfer of stocks up into the thousands. Bullock advanced 7 1/2 cents and closed strong at 8 1/2 cents, buyer 8 1/2 cents. In all 4,500 shares of this stock changed hands. Tintic Combination was not as heavily bought as Bullock, but it held steady around 8 cents.

The market for Colorado is somewhat higher than it has been for some time. It sold today at \$3.65, \$3.67 1/2 and \$3.62 1/2. Iron Blossom was strong. The market throughout showed but slight changes. Uncle Sam again became normal this morning and sold for 12 cents. On the curb market Denjohn brought out a bid of 14 cents and was offered at 16 cents. West Quincy was offered at 15 cents and a bid of 32 cents was made for Planchon Central. Standard, Mineral Flat was offered at 14 cents and 12 cents was the bid.

In the morning sales yesterday stocks reading Newhouse should have been Ohio Copper.
