June 15 .--- Four persons were drowned tonight when an automobile carrying a pleasure party of six became unmanageable, shot at wild speed down Fifty-sixth street, and bounded from an open pier into the North river. John Bailer, the chauffeuer was car-ried into the river with the machine but managed to free himself and swim to safety. John Notan, one of the party, jump-ed from the run-away machine as it neared the end of the dock. After taking his employer home to-night Bailer invited his friends for a pleasure ride. With the party he ran the machine down Fifty-sixth street at fair speed, intending to go out on the dock. In some manner the brake failed to work and the machine began to skid. Down on the dock it fiew and Notan leaped just in time. The four victims were carried down into the water. The body of Mrs. Cole-man was recovered shortly before mid-night tonight. After swimming to the pler Bailer went to the relatives of the four drowned persons and notified them of the accident.
