

LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

Trains on the Extension.—The trains on the Utah Southern Extension are now running as far as Black Rock, a point about twenty-five miles south of Desert. The work of laying the track to Panguitch is going forward energetically.

Last Offices.—The obsequies of Sister Darke, of the 9th Ward, were held in the ward meeting house at 11 a. m., yesterday. The large assembly of friends and relations was addressed by Elders Chas. W. Penrose, Jeter Clinton and Bishop S. A. Woolley, and a long cortege followed the remains to their final resting place. Sister Darke was aged 82, well esteemed and respected, was an early member of the Church and came from Birmingham, England. She was the mother of thirteen children, six of whom are now living and were all present at the funeral. One of her sons is our fellow townsman, Mr. Sidney W. Darke, of the Salt Lake Herald.

Funeral.—The funeral services over the remains of Brother Henry C. Cushing, who died suddenly last Saturday night, were held in the 11th Ward Assembly Rooms yesterday afternoon, at two o'clock. There was a very large attendance, the building being filled, and many standing outside. The deceased had many friends and was highly respected. The congregation was addressed by Elders Charles W. Penrose, Robert F. Nielsen and Joseph E. Taylor. The members of the Salt Lake Fire Brigade, to which the deceased had belonged, were also present, and headed by Chief Engineer Ottlinger, followed the remains to the cemetery, as did a very large company of friends in carriages and on foot.

The "Christy" vs. the "Miner."—The preliminary examination in the libel suit instituted by the Christy Mining Company of Silver Reef, against the editors of the Miner, of that place, lasted seven days, and is said to be the longest preliminary examination ever held in this territory. The Miner, notwithstanding the threats made to demolish it, if it continued to publish articles respecting the matter, is still firing away briskly and re-affirming its original theory that the Buckeye Reef is a faulted and dislocated portion of the White Reef, which declaration with certain accompanying reflections upon Captain Lubbock and the Christy Company, was the cause of the libel suit being planted. The outcome of the affair is yet undetermined. We glean the above from the Miner of the 17th inst.

Items from the South.—We have been favored with the perusal of a letter written April 11th, 1890, by Elder Edith B. Edlefsen, now laboring in Fannin County, Georgia, to Elder Jos. H. Parry, of this city, from which we make the following extracts:

"Our health and spirits are good, as usual. We are still in our old field of labor. I have baptized and confirmed two adults and my companion, T. W. Howard, has baptized three in all. Yesterday I received a release to return home any time after the first of June.
 "The blockade distillers' and the revenue officers are having lively times in this neighborhood. One John A. Stewart, of Morgan, the same man that threatened to hector whip you and me at the time we passed through there last Fall, if he could make it, has been given the undertaking to break up all the illicit stills in the county, and was getting on finely, confiscating teams, wagons and implements owned and used by the Moonshiners. He had destroyed a number of stills, when one night last week, a crowd of armed men went to his place, burned up and destroyed some 800 bushels of corn and a store full of goods belonging to him. So you see they are having quite a time of it. Mr. Stewart may have mobbing enough without touching the Moonshiners.

A Point of Fact.—A communication has just reached us which calls attention to an alleged error in the description of the Assembly Hall, published April 1st. Our correspondent, who signs himself "Fact," is a painter, worked on the decorations of the ceiling of that building, and says the question is frequently asked if W. C. Morris did all the nice work on that ceiling. "Fact," thereupon proceeds, in answer to the question, and "in justice to his fellow laborers," to give the names of some eight painters who assisted in the work, under the direction of Mr. Morris. "I cannot see," he goes on to say, "that it is productive of any good to ignore the laborers of those who assisted," etc., and concludes his complaint in this stinging way: "We might suggest a little more caution on the part of reporters, not to publish mere assertion for fact." To all of which we reply: The News did not say W. C. Morris personally did all the painting, any more than it said David James did all the plumbing, or that Henry Grow did all the carpentering. A reporter usually states in his business to gain and give information in the simplest truthful way, and a newspaper is not the place for reciting what is taken from a directory and giving the name and business of every man employed on a public building which is attempted to describe. Of course we concede that more men than those mentioned in our description were necessary to complete the building, but we really did not have space to give the name of each mechanic and laborer.

City Council.—Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council convened for the transaction of business on Tuesday, April 20, 1890; Mayor Little presiding:

Two petitions were submitted, one signed by P. O. Thomassen and 104 others, the other signed by Charles Smith and 89 others, all residents of the 17th, 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st wards, asking that a path or road be graded on that portion of Wall Street from Walnut Street leading to the bridge over the City Creek, and which was built about two years ago by order of the Council, and from thence to grade a path or road through a strip of land four rods wide, landy grant, by President John Taylor, in continuation of Wall Street from the bridge across west to First East Street. By the granting of this petition, the signers represented that residents of the above-named wards would be greatly benefited in their business and social relations and would be afforded a great boon. Both petitions were received and referred to the committee on streets and alleys.

A petition signed by Samuel Paul and eight other residents of the 12th Ward, asking that the mains of the waterworks be extended from First South Street on East Street to the south end of the block west of Second South Street, as they were very desirous of getting the water to their houses. Received and referred to the committee on waterworks, who were instructed to take into their consideration several other petitions now awaiting action asking that the mains of the waterworks be extended in other directions and report upon them all.

A petition from A. S. Hill, manager of the Utah Lighting and Power Company, was received, submitting a proposition for putting up a lighting rod on the City Hall for \$9 less than the eastern prices of last year. Laid on the table.

A petition signed by D. C. Young and four others was submitted, asking that the course of a certain water running through Mr. L. D. Young's place, in the 8th Ward, be changed, and that the said stream be removed to the public street.

John H. Ruml petitioned for the privilege of placing some material for plastering on the street in front of John W. Leary's residence on First East Street. Granted under the usual restrictions.
 The committee on improvements, to whom was referred the report of improving Washington Square by the planting of trees, etc., reported that they had been unable to procure suitable trees of the number and kind required, and recommended that the improvement be deferred until next year. Report accepted and suggestion adopted.
 The committee appointed to supervise the construction of the Jordan and Salt Lake City Canal, reported that during the month of March work had progressed favorably, and that the canal was under contract, several contractors having finished up their jobs. The amount paid out on account of excavation and material for the canal, ending March 31st, 1890, was \$5,429.30, as shown by vouchers accompanying the report. Referred to the committee on roads and bridges.
 The committee on public grounds, to whom was referred the petition of W. N. Cook, asking that he be granted the right to purchase a certain tract of land between block 33 and 34, and the United States military reservation, reported that the city was not the owner of said land, and consequently had no jurisdiction in the matter.
 The committee on irrigation, to whom was referred the petition of W. H. Howe, asking permission to lay a water pipe from the water ditch opposite the north side of his premises, in the 5th Ward, to convey water to his house and lot for domestic use and sprinkling a small lawn, reported favorably on said petition with the proviso that the water used through said pipes shall be only that to which his lot is rightfully entitled, and that it be under the control of the city waterworks. Adopted.
