

Later and fuller returns show the election of M. E. Post, democrat, as delegate to Congress from Wyoming by 150 majority.

The Governor-General of Kasan will be tried shortly for forcibly attempting to convert 700,000 Tartars to the orthodox faith.

The election of members of the new great council of Geneva has resulted in a victory for the anti-Catholic and radicals.

The New York Press Club gave a brilliant reception last evening to Thurlow Weed on the occasion of his 83rd birthday.

Many colonists have already moved into Indian Territory, and not less than 2,000 whites are scattered along the public lands.

The idea of the expedition of Lough Mask to Lord Erneshouse was started by the parish priest, who is organizing the movement.

Directors of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad were elected yesterday. Net earnings, \$3,987,000; increase over last year, \$4,124,000.

The rebels attacked a small force of Cape troops occupying Basuto. Chief Lerothdis' village and troops were obliged to evacuate.

The commander of troops in St. Petersburg district has confirmed the sentences of convicted Nihilists with slight modifications.

The weather for the great boat race was mild and the wind was light on the flames this morning, but the water was lumpy.

The Pope yesterday, in accepting a pair of embroidered shoes from the ladies of San Francisco, said that he would wear them next Easter.

General McCook reports that the army schools are doing good work, but that a change in the system of providing teachers is necessary.

At Toronto there was unprecedented excitement and exultation over Hanlan's victory. The city wins over \$300,000 by the victory.

The passenger depot of the New Orleans, St. Louis and Chicago Railroad at New Orleans, was burned with two coaches; loss \$30,000.

The wife of Samuel David, son of J. H. David, a prominent lawyer of New York, was found murdered this morning on the porch of her house.

The entrances to the burning Nova Scotia mine have been closed by putting down bundles of pressed hay and brush and throwing on earth.

Texas returns are very slow in coming in, but the re-election of Jones, independent, for Congress from the fifth Texas district is conceded.

Reports on the French beet crop class it as among the worst, as regards quality. Advices from Germany and part of Austria are better.

The report of the committee which has been learning the accounts of the defaulting cashier of Boston places his total defalcation at \$89,234.

If the petition to Lord Erneshouse proves unsuccessful, the tenants intend to hold a meeting in the northern counties and appeal to northern tenants.

There is a growing demand for silver coin, caused partly by government's paying for its transportation from Washington to any part of the country.

A fire is reported raging in the State insane asylum at St. Peter, Minnesota, and an engine has been sent up from St. Paul. There are 600 inmates.

It is rumored that Hanlan has decided not to row in the regatta for the American prizes. Blackman has retired from the contest, owing to sickness.

Wall Street's prediction of higher rates of interest is based upon the absorption of \$125,000,000, or more, in the construction of railroads to the Pacific Coast.

The jury in the case of James A. Hedden, defaulting cashier of the Newark Savings Bank, brought in a verdict of guilty of embezzlement and malfeasance.

The arrival of French Monks at Alcantara and Barcelona, caused a hostile popular demonstration. They were compelled to re-embark from the latter place.
