A WORD FROM SANPETE COUNTY.

MANTI, Sanpete Co., U.T. Feb. 9th, 1862.

EDITOR NEWS—DEAR SIR:

With your permission, I will renew my acquaintance with you by communicating some few items of interest, being confident that any thing that tends to keep the public posted up on matters pertaining to the common weal of this our Mountain Home will be acceptable to your readers.

In the first place, as it is some time since I shook the hand with you as a correspondent, it may be well to inform you that Sanpete county remains where it was, notwithstanding the late rains and floods have demolished quite a number of buildings, and among the rest, the meeting house at Manti, saying nothing about many "smaller habitation" in Manti city—some delapidated adobe buildings come down, which saved the City Council the dignified trouble of declaring them nuisances and causing many to congratulate themselves on their possession of good substantial stone buildings; others more immediately concerned have been made to turn their eyes towards one of the best stone quarries in this Territory, adjacent to Manti, and to begin to talk about patronizing shingle machines, nail factories, and mechanism in general and to declare a determination to eschew forever, in presence of such facilities, adobies for building purposes.

So you see that, although the late rains dissolved some things, they have, in reality, done no damage, but on the contrary, will give a stimulus to advancement and improvement, and to the employment of the various facilities so profusely and idly scattered in the settlements of this county. As to how far a person can be a good citizen without a continuous improvement of intellect and in temporalities I leave to others to decide.

I am gratified to learn, through the NEWS, that the people north of us are so wide awake to the general good; and I perceive, among other matters of interest, in G. S. L. City, the military spirit is being revived. That reminds me that on the 7th inst, the quaint city of Manti was aroused from its usual quietude by roll of drums and strains of martial music emanating from the Martial Band of the 1st battalion of Sanpete Militia, N. L., the officers of that corps having assembled by previous arrangement to hold a military dress ball. The affair came off with unusual eclat, the Commandant of the district, Col. R. W. Allred and Staff being present. The ball being intended but as the commencement of a series of similar entertainment, to be extended through the whole district.

It is intended to have officer's schools and schools for soldiers established and by such means cause the officers and men to understand and become familiar with each other, I may add that Hardie's tactics are applied and adopted in our drills as far as our peculiar organizations will admit.

In conclusion, I may venture to assert that every intelligent citizen of this county are, with intense interest, contemplating and watching the political movements of the Regions Below, with a confident assurance that every thing will work together for good.

FIRST ELECTION UNDER THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF DESERET.
