Feasible Flood.

DAVENPORT, 30.—The river has risen two and a half inches in 15 hours. Navigation is dangerous for

rafts.

Quincy, 30.—The river has risen

inches since 9 a. m. The

water is now three inches higher

than at the rise last spring and

the highest since 1851. It is still

rising.

Hannibal, 20.—The river has

risen 13 inches in 24 hours. It is

now even with the highest mark

last spring. The levee is still intact,

but a leak is looked for at any

moment.

New York, 20.—A Quincy special

shows there was eight inches of water

on the tracks of the Quincy, Mis-

souri & Pacific division of the Wash-

ington & Northwestern Railroad across the river, and the

entirement was washed away. A

construction train was sent

with rock and 1,000 bags of sand

to stop the water from cutting

the roadway. The St. Louis, Keokuk & Northwestern Railroad is

also much troubled by the flood.

In the city the large factories along

the river are suspended, and the

damage in the city is comparatively

light. Hundreds of cattle are

wandering about in the Missouri bot-

tom and as they take the railroad

track to keep out of the water, they

greatly impede the trains. Seven

were killed by one freight train

last night. The river is still

rising steadily and the highest

point is expected to-night or to-mor-

row.

Burlington, 20.—No damage from

high water mark; river falling. It

is a foot below high water mark

of last year.
