FRAGMENTS.

THE REMIGRANTS are expected at the D. & R. G. W. station at 7 o'clock this evening.

G. W. JOHNSON, a penitentiary convict, has made an excellent model of a full rigged ship.

THERE are three cases of scarlet fever in the family of the Rev. T. C. Hill, 41 E. Third South Street.

THE body of Joseph France, 72 years of age, was brought from Centerville to this city for interment to-day.

Mrs. CLARA FOLTZ, attorney of San Francisco, and Mrs. G. S. Erb, were in attendance at the Supreme Court session this morning.

JACK APPELBY was arrested this afternoon for drawing a pistol on H. J. Faust, in the Fountain saloon. After telephoning for the police Faust disappeared and could not be found by the officers.

MATILDA REBER, the woman who gave her name yesterday at the police court, as Mrs. Nusslein (not Mrs. Nusslein as erroneously stated yesterday) was sentenced to thirty days in the city jail, for vagrancy.

JOE MILLER, an employee of Warner's brewery, arrested in a house of ill-fame a couple of weeks ago, was on trial in the police court this afternoon, before a genuine open venire jury of twelve men.

ALEXO HUDSON, a Chilean athlete, is in town. He is traveling through the territory giving exhibitions of light and heavy balancing, ground tumbling and contortions. His head is adorned with a growth of long black hair. Judging from his build, although not over medium height, his strength and agility must be extraordinary.

LOCAL NEWS.

Clever Performances.—Professor and Miss Steen give their performance in the Opera House to-night. It is said to be wonderful and perplexing. They claim to duplicate any trick done by any spiritualist, and execute it more scientifically. They give four successive exhibitions.

The Inquest.—Coroner Geo. J. Taylor held an inquest last evening over the body of Charles Mulhall. The jurors were Herbert Pembroke, T. J. Angell and Oscar Hardy, and after hearing the evidence they returned a verdict in accordance with the facts already published.

Thomas Barber, who committed the deed which caused Mr. Mulhall's death, was bound over to await the action of the grand jury, and was brought to the county jail last evening, for safe-keeping.

Theatre.—On Thursday evening the well-known tragedian, George C. Minn, commences a three night engagement at the Theatre with "A Fool's Revenge." The box office will open at 10 a. m. tomorrow for the sale of reserved seats for all of the performances. The Iowa State Register says of him:

An Able Artist.—This morning we were shown a life-sized bust portrait of the late Elder Francis Platt, of the 13th Ward. The picture is from the artistic hand of Prof. Fernando Lara, a native of Mexico, connected with the Brigham Young Academy at Provo. The likeness is excellent, the artist having retained the natural expression with great fidelity. The family and friends of the deceased are greatly pleased with the portrait, and young men of Utah who have developed into fair hands at portrait producing received their only lessons in drawing from Prof. Lara, who is worthy of patronage.

From the South.—Mr. A. M. Buchanan, who has been traveling through the southern part of the Territory in the interests of the Juvenile Instructor, returned a few days ago, having been very successful in his trip. The excellent young people's magazine for which he has been canvassing, now has a larger circulation among the people than at any previous time, and the number of subscribers is steadily increasing.

Brother Buchanan visited the counties of Sanpete, Sevier, Beaver, Iron and Washington, and reports in a prosperous condition generally. He thinks the Sanpete County settlements take the lead in having good meeting houses, though there are some excellent buildings in the other places visited by him.

Searching West Jordan.—The settlement of West Jordan, southwest of the city, appears to lay some attractions for deputy marshals at present. Another visit having been paid to that place this morning at about 4:30 a. m., a number of deputies called at the house of Mr. Olaus Johnson, on the State Road, and inquired for that gentleman, but finding that he was not at home the members of the family were summoned to appear before the grand jury on the 2nd of August. A number of other places were also visited, but no arrests were made.

Among the witnesses required to be present at the grand jury session on August 2nd were members of the families of Bishop A. Gardner, and Messrs. Turner and Bennett.

Police Items.—In the police court this morning the case of P. W. Haight, for assault on W. P. McElroy, on May 27th, was called up. Haight was not present, but was represented by Theodore Burmaster, who presented an affidavit signed by McElroy, in which the latter agreed to withdraw the suit, the injuries received. McElroy objected, however, saying he had signed the agreement on the condition that it was to be presented to the court yesterday, so that witnesses would not be subpoenaed for to-day. He was willing to withdraw the complaint, but would not pay the additional cost of witnesses' fees incurred through the defendant's neglect in not informing the court before the witnesses were summoned. The case was finally set for hearing on Tuesday, June 15th.

Wm. Langbehn, for being drunk, was fined \$5.

John F. Price, for drunkenness and profanity, paid \$10.

Morris Goodman was held for trial on charges of drunkenness, profanity and vagrancy, and asked a plea of not guilty.

A resolution was sent to Sen. Douglas, a soldier named M. E. Morgan, who is in custody for assaulting a woman.
