NEW ORLEANS LYNNCHES.

New Orleans Negroes Kill and Are Killed.

Chicago, June 2.—A New Orleans special says, "On the Grand Bay plantation, in Pointe Coupee Parish, on Sunday, the number of negroes were engaged in a game of craps, when a dispute arose among them which resulted in the killing of Will Jenkins, a laborer. The killing was done by two negroes, Lazarus, a man of mixed origin, and James Alexander, and Sam Hunter and another negro, the name of whom is not learned."

A Dispute Arises.

Chicago, June 2.—The dry season has suddenly destroyed the farms learned early this morning by a fire which threatened to destroy the whole eastern Illinois. The loss is severely estimated at \$100,000. The fire was started to have originated from over-loaded chimneys in the dry room.

In the Attempt to Save Another.

Holyoke, Mass., June 2.—John Hargood, a 15-year-old son of a prominent citizen of the city, was shot and while attempting to save a comrade who was drowning with cramps.

A Woman Killed.

St. Louis, June 2.—Mrs. Barbara Stroh, a widow living in the northern portion of the city, was killed last night by being struck on the head with a stone or rock hurled from a quarry 50 yards away.

Ottawa, June 2.—A prominent French-Canadian politician, who planned to stand for election, will be nominated by Mr. John Thompson, who will be the premier and minister of justice. Other changes will be made. Ministerial changes will be made.
