Chas. Popper also makes a fine show; and his large black-tail deer was soon cut up, called for and taken home. Chas. Taylor, and the owners of the other stalls, have plenty of stock to coax the most epicurean.

The stores on Main Street appear to be slow in decorations, the prettiest though were at G. W. Davis, Stubbs & Kirkwood, Day's, Stringfellow and Lee's, and Kelson's illumination. We were much surprised, upon stepping into the Co-operative store, to find that their large invoice of toys, notions and "fix nax" were all sold. The small stores on First South Street, have made an effort, and with a good effect, quite conspicuous among which are the stores of Harris & Son and James Brown. One essential item for the season are the fine furs at the Emporium Building, which are neat, superb and comfortable. Taking it altogether Santa Claus will have no trouble to obtain presents enough, if the party families are only agreeable, and there will be a few left for New Year's.
