The temperature changes were slight except a fall of 10 deg. to 14 deg. over portions of Colorado, Arizona, Washington, and Montana; and a rise of 10 deg. to 20 deg. over portions of Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas, and South Dakota. Fair weather with moderate temperature is indicated for this locality tonight and Sunday.

M. H. Hennessy is confined to his room at the Cullen hotel, suffering from pleurisy contracted during a hard snow trip in the mountains.

E. W. Wilson of the Commercial National bank, who has been ill with threatened attack of typhoid, is reported to be much improved today.

An important business meeting of the First Unitarian society will be held at their hall, downstairs room, 149 Second East street, on Tuesday evening, Dec. 1, at 8 o'clock.

Elder Adelbert Clawson, of this city, who recently left on a mission to Samoa and was taken ill at Papeete, is now well again and able to pursue his work as a missionary.

Two cases of smallpox have been reported to the county commissioners. Two miners at Bingham, named Alfred and Rasmussen, are afflicted with the disease and are now under quarantine.

A social will be given on Tuesday evening, Dec. 1, in Electrical-Workers' hall, First South and Main streets, by the Ladies' Society of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen, Victor lodge, No. 89.

Twenty-eight old land claims situated between this city and Salt Lake pavilion were filed yesterday with County Recorder Walter J. Meeks by Charles K. Rowland and associates. Each claim covers 160 acres.

The grand bazaar and home market to be given by the ladies of the First Methodist church will be held in the church parlors beginning next Wednesday evening at 8:30. Several prominent musicians will assist, the sale continuing through the week.

Veterinarians report the discovery of a number of cases of pinkeye among Salt Lake horses. While it is not thought that the disease will become epidemic, it is recommended that during stormy weather, especially the equines receive the best of care.

Salt Lake is to be headquarters of a branch of the Brotherhood of American Yeomen to be organized in this state. Both men and women may join the order, which has central offices in Des Moines, Ia., and branches in twenty-one states. Dr. D. N. A. Downing, state manager for Utah, is in the city for the purpose of organizing the lodge.

This is the last day in which taxes may be paid without additional penalty, as after this date no taxes will be received by the County Treasurer until a week from next Monday. In the meantime, delinquents' names and descriptions of property will be advertised, and an additional charge of 25 cents will be made to the amount of taxes due and unpaid.

County Attorney Westervelt has issued a complaint charging William H. Jirold with obtaining money under false pretenses. It is charged that Jirold purchased some furniture from the Harris Furniture company on the installment plan and before it was paid for he mortgaged it to J. T. Stringer. The complaint has been filed in the police court.
