THURSTON PERMANENT CHAIRMAN.

AT LEAST ONE MORE DAY.

Over and Over—No Nominations Today—Democrats Committee Present Two Reports.

Mr. Loring, June 17.—A chilling rain began at 8 o'clock this morning and the second day of the great Republican convention promises to be very disagreeable. Fog and drizzle are hanging low and the spirits of the delegates are correspondingly depressed.

There is little interest left by the growth of the delegates now that McKinley's nomination is certain and the platform settled except perhaps as to few nominal points of procedure to which conservatives feel are much interested.

There has been no exciting oratory and the street parades kept open the trade. The fog over the vice-presidency will probably put him into the convention as soon as the nomination for President has been made. The fight lies between Edward A. Borden of New Jersey and Morton of New York. The dust seems to be toward Morton in spite of the protests of the anti-Bartlet faction in New York headed by Miller, and of Mark Hanna. However, the estimate may change very rapidly in either direction after the convention adjourns to permanent organization and audience down to business.

The meeting, if it continues agreeably, will likely electors to the convention, as the delegates are already writing their names to get away. The election of electors will be held on Friday night, Nov. 6, while the convention will be adjourned until Saturday morning.
