BUSINESS STAYS FAIRLY LIVELY

Stocks Firm in Face of Unsatisfactory Conditions Prevalent Outside.

TINTICS STILL FAVORITES.

Consolidation of May Day and Uncle Sam, Being Closed Today, Creates Good Impression.

Business appears to be fairly good in the local mining stock exchange despite the feeling of depression on the outside. The brace is the excellent condition in which Utah's mines are now in. Were it not for the good work going on in the various camps about the state there would be little doing as a combination of circumstances has made the stock game none too popular. Nevada stocks are still being from some strange mysterious cause, the good ones going down with the bad ones offerings; the east has not forgotten the recent flurry and spring is here. While the poets sing of spring, etc., brokers prepare for a long, dull season. Yet in face of all this the local market is fairly lively and the offerings remain firm. For instance saw 17,500 shares of preferred, represented at \$1.65. The Atlas and Tintics are in the limelight where they were at the close of last week. May Day sold today for 31½, 31 and 30½; 1,000 moving at the first price, buyer 30½ at the second price and 500 at the third figure. Uncle Sam, sold at 68 and 69. A meeting was held in the Uncle Sam offices today to ratify the consolidation arrangement which will join the May Day and Uncle Sam. This merger is satisfactory to the stockholders and from the way the two stocks held firm, it is evidently in favor to those who are in the market.
