EASTERN DISPATCHES.

ALBANY, 5.—Indications are that the Democrats and Liberals have carried the city by a majority of 1,040.

NEW YORK, 5.—The impression that O'Brien will be defeated grows stronger every hour, although his friends and his himself claim a substantial majority.

WILMINGTON, N. C., 5.—Unofficial returns in this city give Grant 906 majority.

CHICAGO, 5.—The returns, secretary in Consul General of the German Empire at Shanghai, China, who was traveling on a furlough for the benefit of his health, fell dead at the corner of Pauline and Kinzie streets, yesterday evening. He has been identified as Dr. Vincenzo in this city for some time.

HARTFORD, 5.—The returns from Hartford, New Haven, New Britain, Meriden and Waterbury give Grant 1,349 majority.

WILMINGTON, N. C., 5.—Republicans claim the State by 1,900 to 2,000 majority.

NEW YORK, 5.—Syracuse Grant 900 majority. Poughkeepsie Grant 291 majority.

BROOKLYN, 5.—Ten wards give Greeley 14,884, Grant 10,797.

BOSTON, 5.—City except last Ward give Grant 5,000 majority.

CONCORD, 5.—Eighty towns give Grant 17,068; Greeley 14,285; Woodbury 1,670.

BALTIMORE, 5.—O'Brien, Democrat, 1,234 majority for congress in the 3d district. Swann, Democrat, is elected to congress in the 4th district by 1,372 majority.

PENNSYLVANIA, 5.—The Rhode Island returns are complete except Rock Island. Grant received 13,778 votes, Greeley 5,305. In the 1st Congressional district, Haines, Republican, received 184 votes. Davis, Democrat, 3,134 in the 2nd.

HARTFORD, Conn., 5.—Gen. Hawley's majority in this district is 611. Convent goes for Grant by about 5,000 majority.

HARTFORD, Conn., 5.—Greeley's majority is 468.

SOUTH BEND, Ind., 5.—Grant's majority is 418.

FRANKFURT, Neb., 5.—This city gives Grant a majority of 235.

CHICAGO, 5.—Eighteen precincts of eight wards, and one town in Cook county give Grant a net majority of 815. The State has probably gone for Grant by thirty or forty thousand.

Private dispatches from New York say that New Jersey has gone Republican by three thousand majority.

DES MOINES, 5.—The indications are that Grant has carried the State by 40,000.

UTICA, 5.—Ellis H. Roberts is elected to Congress by 2,500 majority.

BALTIMORE, 5.—Greeley had 9,066 majority.

ROCHESTER, 5.—Grant has 1,500 majority.

The State will give Dix 40,000.

NEW YORK, 5.—Havemeyer seems to have been elected mayor.

RICHMOND, Va., 5.—Virginia is conceded to Greeley by 4,000.

DETROIT, 5.—Michigan gives Grant 80,000.

NEWARK, N. J., 5.—The returns from the State are incomplete, but indicate from 5,000 to 10,000 for Grant.

BOSTON, 5.—Grant's majority in Massachusetts is about 65,000.

NEW YORK, 5.—The North's estimate at midnight is that all the old Northern States with South Carolina and Mississippi, in all 233 electoral votes, have declared for Grant, leaving 113 electoral votes all from the Southern States, for Greeley. Grant will have at least 40,000 majority. In the State of New York Greeley is running behind Kernan and the State ticket about 15,000 votes.

The Liberal gains in the rural districts of the Republican counties are more than compensated for by the Grant gains in the cities of the State.

Havemeyer, at the time of writing, seems to be elected mayor.

O'Brien, though a favorite in the pools, being a bad third.

Excepting the mayor, are generally Tammany Democrats.

The Republicans have the legislature of this State by a working majority.

ALEXANDRIA, Va., 5.—The vote between Greeley and Grant is a tie. Harris, Conservative, in the 7th district, is elected to Congress; Hinton, Conservative, in the 8th district.

EUROPEAN.
PARIS, 5.—Henri Rochefort has been permitted to come to Versailles and marry the dying mother of his children, in order to legitimize their birth. The Republic is concluded he will return to prison.

The evacuation of the German and the Upper Maine by the German troops has been completed, and that of California is nearly proceeding.

LONDON.—The Times this morning in an editorial on the result of the Presidential election in America, says the re-election of President Grant will be eminently satisfactory and will defeat the audacious intrigues to secure the control of the government of the United States.

NEW YORK, 5.—Returns from forty-four towns and districts in various parts of the State show that the city has not gained for Grant of 1,583 over the Presidential vote of 1868. Fourteen election districts in the city give Dix 113, Kernan 1,975.

WASHINGTON, 5.—The President has a dispatch from Blaine that Maine gives him thirty thousand majority.

A Concord dispatch says New Hampshire is Republican by three thousand.

New York, 5.—The Republican State Central Committee claim the State for Grant by a large majority.
