## FOREIGN.

Feeding the Rishons.  
EDINBURGH, 12.—Mr. Robeson, a member of the British team, gave an informal address to the American team tonight, at the City Club. Several residents were present, and expressed regret that there had been no opportunity to give the American team a formal reception. The Association of Scotland's kindly feeling to the U. S. Gladiators says that nearly all the members of the team will reach London in time to take part individually at Wimbledon on Saturday.

## CANADA.

MONTREAL, 12.—Monsigneur Charles La Rique, Bishop of St. Hyacinthe, died at Beauport this morning.

Yesterday afternoon, a carriage with Mrs. Bernard, two daughters and a son and two nieces, was run over by a speed train near Beauport. Both the two ladies, Mrs. Miller and Miss Bernard and one daughter were so badly hurt that they are not expected to live.

## FRANCE.

Education Bill Abrogated.  
PARIS, 12.—In the Assembly today, the university education bill was discussed in detail, clause by clause. All the amendments moved by the Liberals were rejected by narrow majorities. The clericalists, however, continued to insist that the bill be voted down.

## SPAIN.

Pursuing Garregay.  
MADRID, 12.—An official dispatch says that General Delaire has driven Garregay from Torrelles, Guadalajara, and Bobadilla. The Carlist forces received the Alfonsoists stoutly, and lost many men in killing, wounded, and prisoners. They retreated to the Valley of Uxama in the Pyrenees. General Delaire is still pursuing them. General Martinez Campos is making preparations to join in the pursuit.

## Official Announcement.

The government announces that military combinations are made which will force Gen. Delaire to take refuge in France or to accept battle under circumstances which are sure to result disastrously, and if made desperate he should attempt to turn back on his line of retreat.

Threats of Lynching Carlist Priests.

The Epoch reports that 1,000 Carlist prisoners have arrived at Valencia. The populace threatens to lynch some of the Carlist officers, and the authorities condemned them on a man-of-war to prevent a massacre.
