HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, S.—The Speaker, in reference to the prisoners Wells and Anderson, said he had not charge of the witnesses, but having charge of the rooms of the Capitol, he had ordered the prisoners to be transferred to the room of the education committee; the committee had objected, and the Sergeant-at-Arms could only return them.

Wood said he did not wish the prisoners to appear as inhumanly treated, but thought the ordinary method of requiring a doctor's certificate as to the health of the sick man should be followed.

Conger denounced any party which was endeavoring to go into the detention of his health for the purpose of producing papers not in his power to produce. The American mind would perceive that it was an infamous wrong, and suggestive of the thimble-rig and Inquisition days.

Clymer said the Sergeant-at-Arms had done his utmost to make the room comfortable. It was well heated, lighted and ventilated, and the preceding Congress had used it for the same purpose. They were allowed to converse with friends.

Conger denied this.

The Speaker said the resolution directed that they be kept in close custody.

Banks called attention to the absurdity of that construction of the resolution, as they had been taken before the House committee and committed to the custody of the Sergeant-at-Arms.

When witness was testifying before the committee he was a free man.

After further discussion, the resolution was passed.

Cox moved to refer the resolution to the Louisiana election committee, with instructions to report immediately whether Wells' statement was true.
