FOREIGN NEWS.

FRANCE.

Another prominent communist arrested. The national say they are disappointed but not concerned. VERNALES, 15.—A motion has been made to prolong the powers of the Assembly, with Thiers as President for two years; and to elect a committee to draw up a bill for a constitutional government. VERNALES, 16.—The rumored ministerial modifications are contradicted. The Communist Orléans has been arrested. Nothing has been decided relative to removing the state of siege in Paris. PARIS, 16.—The national, in their proclamation, say they are disarmed but not conquered. They are still a handful, but strong. They say that Favre and Trochu are the authors of their misfortunes, aided by capital and priestcraft. "On them we place the responsibility of the confagration. We have no intention of fighting. In the divisions at the polls will be our reaction. They took our arms but not our votes. Vive Social République; Vive Commune!"

EAST INDIES.

CALCUTTA, 16.—A department of agriculture is established, and Mr. Hume is appointed secretary.

GREAT BRITAIN.

German soldiers in Paris insulted.

LONDON, 16.—The Countess of Paris last night gave birth to a daughter. Napoleon and Eugénie have made a visit to the Prince of Wales. The Times states the French loan will amount to only two millions of francs. A Times special dispatch from Paris reports that the state of siege will cease to-day. The reports of renewed agitation in the Belleville and Villettes quarters are unfounded. German soldiers visiting Paris are occasionally insulted in the streets, and have been refused seats at tables in the restaurants. Paul Maurice is released. There will be no transfer of the executive or legislative departments, until October. The German soldiers next week for the trial of Rochefort, Avez and Rook. It is said if Victor Emmanuel enters Rome the Pope will go to Corsica. It is reported that Piat has been arrested in London. A dispatch from a priest Fabricius compliments Thiers on the overthrow of the Commune. Bismarck has promised to diminish the army of occupation. The amount proposed for the French loan, it is said will be reduced one fifth. The tramway from Islington to Moorgate is opened. Others are being built. By an accident on Murray Frith four persons were drowned. Donay's corps has gone to Lyons, with a mission to disarm the nationalists in the valley of the Rhone, from Lyons to Marseilles. Clinchett, resident at Versailles, and L'Admiral at Paris with sixty thousand. About twenty thousand go to Marseilles. The 2nd corps is in Versailles and the principal towns are garrisoned. The chief newspapers have constituted themselves an electoral committee to support the republican candidate whose career guarantees law and order.

NEW YORK.

New York, 16.—The most extensive Hebrew library in the world, collected in Amsterdam, has been purchased by the Jewish congregation of Fifth Avenue for the Jewish seminary. The reported discovery of a mammoth oyster bed on the Long Island coast proves to be a mammoth swindle. The morning papers say, Claffin and Woodbush, the noted women brokers, have instituted a libel suit against Henry Ward Beecher and the publishers of the Christian Union, laying the damages at \$250,000. The ground of the suit is in the publication, in the Christian Union, of which Beecher is editor, of Mrs. Harriet Beecher Stowe's new novel "My Wife and I," in which are introduced two female characters which, it is alleged, are intended to represent Mrs. Woodbush and Mrs. Claffin. Lady Theresa, whose wedding days were supposed to be over, in consequence of the injuries received at South Park and not in training, is thought she will be able to appear on the turf before the close of the season.

CALIFORNIA.

San Francisco, 16.—The entire corps of civil engineers employed on the California Pacific Railroad, are ordered to this morning to receive instructions and prepare for field work on the line of the eastern extension. They will be distributed at intervals along the entire line to Salt Lake, and the whole surveys will be completed this summer. Charles Hoffman, chief topographical engineer of the California geological survey, has been appointed chief of topographical engineering at Harvard college. The new city hall commissioners again postpone the sale of the corner of Buena Vista, and will continue to do so until the injunction served on them is disposed of. The board of trustees of the State University, voted to delegate power to establish fifth classmen in various parts of the State, to Dr. Fitzgerald, superintendent of public instruction. It was also resolved to establish a botanical garden at Berkeley; also that the purchasers of University timberlands be required to pay in full the time of purchase. The board also adopted rules governing the location and sale of all lands owned by the University. Gen. W. H. Howard, Jr. and Hon. J. K. Knapp and families, arrived to-day.
