The matrimonial customs of the country hold the wife directly responsible for the life of her husband. If the husband dies, no matter from what cause, she is to blame. The Eng-lish government has prevented the burning of the widow, but she still must remain a perpetual widow. She is clad in the meanest garb and is doomed to drudgery for the rest of her days. "But worse than the problem of per-petual widowhood is the custom of child marriage. In India all of the young girls are married before they are 12 years old. Many of them are married almost as soon as they are born. There are 3,000,000 widows in India not yet three years old.
