## INCOMPETENCY AT STATE INDUSTRIAL

Citizens' Committee's Recommendations Made Public to-night—Want New Staff.

## FUNERAL OF HERBERT REEDER

Impressive Services in Fourth Ward Meetinghouse—Car Line Completed to Hermitage.

OGDEN, July 9.—This evening the board of trustees of the State Industrial school will make public the list of recommendations which were submitted yesterday by the citizens' committee which prosecuted the recent investigation against Supt. Thomas. At the close of the investigation the committee composed of Mrs. Elizabeth Bishop, Mrs. Kate Hillard and E. A. Battel were invited to prepare a list of recommendations for the consideration of the board. This the committee has done and their report is a voluminous one.

It is reported the recommendations state there is a general lack of supervision manifest at the institution and practically the entire staff is recommended for removal except W. B. Knapp, the assistant superintendent, whose retention is requested. The report, it is stated, accuses almost everyone else of incompetency and cites as proof the conditions at the institution.

## FUNERAL OF HERBERT REEDER

OGDEN, July 9.—The funeral of Herbert R. Reeder, the young man who was drowned at the Lagoon last Monday afternoon, was held at the Fourth ward meetinghouse yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Bishop E. A. Olson presided and the music was furnished by the ward choir and solos by Miss Shorten, Miss Maud Belnap, Miss Frances Rogers and Orson Griffin. The speakers were Elder D. O. McKay, President C. F. Middleton, Bishop W. O. Ridges, Patriarch George W. Larkin, Prof. S. D. Bradford, Nathan J. Harris and Bishop Olson. The floral offerings were profuse and beautiful and among them being pieces from the student body of the institution and from the "Acorn" staff. The interment was in the city cemetery.

## VISIT WATER SUPPLY.

OGDEN, July 9.—Yesterday afternoon Mayor Brewster and the members of the city council paid a visit to the Cold Water Spring in Ogden canyon as well as 160 acres of land in that vicinity which John W. Wattle has offered to sell the city. Many of the city officials deem it necessary to procure this acreage and water right in order to give the city a better supply of water for the city. The report with the recommendations will probably be made at the next meeting of the council.

## O. S. L. CONSTRUCTION.

OGDEN, July 9.—Warren L. Wattle of the Utah Construction company has gone to Idaho Falls with a large amount of the equipment for the work upon the Oregon Short Line near that point and for which the company has a large contract. Mr. Wattle will have charge of all the construction work in Idaho which the Utah company has contracts for.

## RAILROAD CROP REPORT.

OGDEN, July 9.—Upon the request of A. L. Mohler, general manager of the Union Pacific railroad at Omaha, Neb., the Utah division has his corps of assistants preparing data and information relative to the crop outlook in this section of the state. The report will also include a report on the horticultural products, probable yields, amount of shipments and comparison with last year. Reports of this kind are secured from the district along the Harbison lines and are compiled in one book and published for the use of railroad officials and the public in general.

## IND. PHONES INSTALLED AGAIN.

OGDEN, July 9.—The differences between the Independent Telephone company and the commissioners of Weber county have been settled and the county offices now have the independent phones installed. About two months ago the phones were ordered out by the county on account of the company refusing to grant the same concession as did the Bell Telephone company. After a number of conferences between the commissioners and representatives of the company the telephone have been reinstated.

## DAMAGE SUIT FILED.

OGDEN, July 9.—William Beckman has brought suit in the district court against the Southern Pacific company to recover \$1,801 alleged to be due for the loss of sheep belonging to Beckman. The complaint alleges that the company agreed to transport to San Francisco 1,711 head of fat sheep, feed, water and care for them at Reno, Nev. The sheep were shipped from Ogden, Feb. 27, 1908, and two days later were unloaded at Reno. During the night of March 1, Beckman alleges that dogs and wild animals got into the stock pens and killed 37 sheep and wounded seven so they died of their injuries, making a loss of \$44.85 and further that other sheep were torn and mangled to such an extent that they died, precluded in value to the amount of \$1,556.15, for which he asks damages.

## PROHIBITION LEAGUE PETITIONS COUNCIL

Makes Strong Pleas for the Closing of Saloons by January First Next.

(Special Correspondence.)  
 PROVO, Utah Co., July 9.—At the council meeting Mrs. M. M. Boyden, Miss Josephine Kellogg, Miss Alice L. Reynolds, Rev. J. Challen and Mr. O. W. Audlin, representing the Prohibition league, appeared before the council and presented numerous signed petitions asking that no liquor licenses be issued to extend later than Jan. 1, 1910. The petitioners were all legal voters, although all had not been visited. Of 1,677 visited, 1,527 had signed the petition, and 150 were opposed to prohibition. Chairman Duffin, who acted as spokesman, was of the opinion that this would probably represent an average of the voters, viz: ninety per cent for and 10 per cent against prohibition. Rev. Smith stated that the objection generally urged by those who had refused to sign was that they wanted state prohibition, and that local prohibition would be successful without state wide prohibition. He called attention to the fact that all movements for betterment begin with small numbers and grew till it was adopted by communities and nations.

Miss Kellogg expressed the hope and belief that Provo, beautiful for situation and desirable in many respects, would become a paradise on earth and the movement for closing saloons and removing the temptation of the open saloon would tend to this end. She urged that the petition be granted.

Chairman Duffin stated that some had objected to signing the petition for the reason that the question was not considered in the last campaign. He ridiculed the idea that nothing should be a subject of legislation for the good of the community that was not a part of a political platform. He also urged that action be taken for the protection of young men who came here from a distance to attend school. The petition was referred to the committee on judiciary and the city attorney.

A petition was presented by Frank Spencer et al. asking that H. J. W. Goddard be allowed \$100 for trees cut on his field for use in stopping the overflow of the river in the Port field. Referring to the committee on irrigation.

Sexton Wide submitted a quarterly report showing \$320.75 collected. Referred to committee on finance.

The committee on fire department reported in the matter of the two paid firemen, who resigned some weeks ago, recommending that the two men be paid \$5 a month for the rest of the year. Report adopted.

## DISTRICT COURT.

PROVO, July 9.—The jury in the case of the State vs. F. P. Forbes brought in a verdict of guilty of burglary in the second degree. Sentence was set for Saturday. The penalty is from one to 20 years in the state prison.

Following this case is the case of the State vs. Daniel Larkins, which is now being tried. Defendant is also charged with burglary, the breaking into C. F. Decker & Co's. warehouse on May 31, it being the same warehouse as the one on which Forbes was convicted.

The following additional cases were done: E. D. Bedford, John Forsythe, Provo; William Kirkham, Luke Titcomb, Lehi; E. S. Ellis Pleasant Grove; Frederick Wall, Jr., William H. Boyle, Santaquin; Jacob Greenwood, Willam J. Shipley, American Fork; David Bowen, Spanish Fork.

The case of E. W. Seeper vs. Mt. Nebo Land and Irrigation company was dismissed at plaintiff's cost. In the case of Elizabeth Thomas Gilson of Spanish Fork, was granted a divorce from M. E. Gilson on the ground of desertion. The parties were married at Spanish Fork in March, 1907, and in May of that year the defendant left her.
