They congratulate the President on his adherence to the Indian policy announced in his inaugural address, and express a hope that its present success may make it permanent. The main reason given for resignation is the amendment to the Indian appropriation bill as passed the House, requiring the examination of accounts of contracts and vouchers to be made in the city of Washington.
