

ANTI JAPANESE RIOT IN VANCOUVER

Numberless People Bruised and Injured by Broken Bottles and Flying Brickbats.

MOB WAS IN A GREAT FRENZY.

Baron Ishii and Consul Hisamitsu Barely Made Their Escape—International Complications Likely.

Seattle, Wash., Sept. 8.—A special to the Post-Intelligencer from Vancouver, B. C., says: Following a riot early in the evening in Vancouver, in which Chinatown and the Japanese quarter were raided and damage done approximating \$15,000, a further demonstration occurred in the early morning hours, in which Kiki Yiro Ishii, chief of the bureau of foreign commerce and head of the Japanese consular service, and Consul Satoru Hisamitsu, of Seattle, were the central figures, and in which riot numberless people were bruised and injured by broken bottles and flying brickbats in the hands of the mob in the throes of frenzy.

NEW YORK'S LARGEST SALE.

New York, Sept. 8.—Exceeding any bond sale ever made by the city of New York will be the sale of corporate stock and bonds for which bids will be opened tomorrow. Bearing an interest of 4 1/2 per cent, \$9,000,000 worth of bonds will be offered, this being \$3,000,000 more than any other sale. It is said that syndicates of bankers and financial institutions has been formed to buy up the entire issue. As only a small portion of the amount is needed by the city now, the balance will be deposited in the banks, thus allowing the financiers not only to collect 4 1/2 per cent interest from the city, but to loan the money to other parties.

NO ACTION TAKEN ON PHILIPPINE SUGAR.

Sacramento, Cal., Sept. 7.—The effort to have the Fifteenth irrigation congress pass a resolution presented by Judge Baker, calling for the withdrawal of the duty levied on timber, has failed. Another important action of the gathering today was its decision to eliminate a resolution protesting against the reading of the minutes of President Roosevelt's cabinet meeting in the Senate. With this latter exception, the report of the committee on resolutions was adopted as read. The minutes of the cabinet meeting and his administration in relation to reclamation, conservation of water and forests, and other matters, was endorsed.

EAGLE TEMPLE BURNED.

Philadelphia, Sept. 8.—Eagle temple, the home of Philadelphia, No. 42, Fraternal Order of Eagles, was destroyed by fire today. The loss is given at \$100,000, covered by insurance.

KILLED IN AUTO ACCIDENT.

Norwalk, Conn., Sept. 8.—Paul McCormick of New York died today as a result of an automobile accident here on Aug. 15, in which his wife was killed.

A MOB OF SOLDIERS.

Went to Release a Comrade from Jail But Were Promptly Dispersed.

Junction City, Kas., Sept. 8.—A mob of nearly 50 soldiers of the farmers' school at Fort Riley came here about 1 o'clock this morning for the purpose of releasing a comrade who was confined in the county jail. The sheriff and city police were notified of their coming and from positions in windows above the jail opened a fire that quickly dispersed the mob as it sought to force an entrance. The authorities at Fort Riley placed guards at the jail and are still in the effort to find the members of the mob. Two arrests have been made. No one was shot.

SMALLPOX EPIDEMIC RAGES IN AUSTRIA.

Vienna, Sept. 8.—There are no signs of abatement in the smallpox epidemic. During the last few days 165,000 persons have been vaccinated. Public meetings and processions have been forbidden.

KOREANS TURN GUERRILLA.

Tokyo, Sept. 8.—The Korean insurgents are abandoning organized resistance to the Japanese. They now desire to destroy the railways and telegraph lines and murder unarmed Japanese whom they already have killed 27, shockingly mutilating the bodies.

JOHNSON-BURTON MAYORALTY CONTEST.

Cleveland, O., Sept. 8.—The contest between Mayor Tom L. Johnson and Congressman Burton for the mayoralty of Cleveland promises to be the most exciting political event in the history of this city. The endorsement of Mr. Burton's candidacy by Theodore Roosevelt, who called the city convention to order, and Mayor Johnson and the ticket with him.
