WASHINGTON, 14.—After routine busi-
ness in the Senate, the Northern Pacific
bill was taken up.

It was reported that the bill was in support
of the proposition to forfeit all the
lands not earned within the time pre-
scribed by Congress.

Mr. Mitchell said that all the government
grants of railroad lands should be for-
feited that had not been earned within
the time prescribed by the granting
acts. He denied that the Northern Pa-
cific had any legal or equitable right to
land not earned.

Mr. Mitchell said the bill before the Senate
proposed to forfeit about 2,000,000 acres
of land adjacent to a portion of the
line that had not been built. As to the
unbuilt branch, he said that the bill
proposed to forfeit the lands along that
branch, for it would prevent the con-
struction of a branch that would be a
penal place of the road, and to that
extent would simply serve to relieve
the railroad company of a part of the
obligation which it had undertaken.

Mr. Mitchell offered an amendment to ex-
clude from the bill the lands already
conveyed to the company, and to limit
the bill to the lands not yet conveyed.
The amendment was adopted.
