The Briscoe Case.—A couple of weeks ago Robert Briscoe, of this city, had an examination before Justice Pyper, on the charge of receiving stolen property. The result of the preliminary hearing was that the Justice placed Briscoe under bonds to await the action of the grand jury, as the evidence showed that there was probable cause to believe that he had received from several young chicken thieves birds that he knew were stolen. To-day he was brought into the Third District Court and arraigned on an indictment found against him. This bill accuses him with having, on Nov. 1st, accepted stolen chickens to the value of \$2.50. He pleaded not guilty, and gave \$500 bonds for his appearance for trial.
