EVENING NEWS.
Saturday, August 17, 1878.

WASHINGTON, 16.—The yellow fever scare in the treasury department has not yet passed away; and the ladies in the redemption bureau look very anxious. Precaution is taken to have packages of money from the fever districts thoroughly disinfected.

New York, 16.—Patrick William Riley, agent, arrived this morning from New Orleans, which place he left on Monday. Yellow fever being reported there, the health authorities are closely watching the common land.

Delaware Breakwater, 16.—The schooner Ida, of New York, Captain Alphonse B. L. L. L., left for New York, to-day, with the entire crew, nine in number, either dead or dying from the yellow fever.

Memphis, 16.—Sixteen new cases of fever and five deaths from it were reported to-day. The deaths are old cases.

CHICAGO, 16.—A most daring and successful robbery was perpetrated at the Palmer House, this afternoon, by which the New York jewelry firm of Max Freedman & Co. lost about \$15,000 worth of goods.

NEW ORLEANS, 16.—A Galveston news special says that the command of the 10th regiment, left the garrison at 2 o'clock this morning. The advanced guard crossed the river early this morning.
