

WESTERN NOTES.

J. Moore, of Nicasio, Marin county, Cal., was run over by the wheels of a loaded wagon and killed a few days ago.

The publisher of the San Bernardino *Guardian* announces that he is "about to make an effort to publish a daily paper."

John T. Barton, of Lodi, Cal., was shot and almost instantly killed, Nov. 1, by his brother Joshua, in a quarrel.

John Venn was accidentally killed by a threshing machine falling on him at South Saanich, British Columbia, Oct. 28.

A miner named James Hooper was killed by a premature blast in the Departure Bay coal mines, British Columbia, Nov. 1.

John C. Perry, alias Texas, was seriously stabbed at Ashland, Oregon, Oct. 30, by a shoemaker named August Waters. Whisky was the cause.

Mary McCarthy, a young and pretty girl of 14, left her home in San Francisco, Oct. 30, and has not been heard of since. Foul play suspected.

Mrs. Kneeland, of San Francisco went down stairs on the morning of Nov. 2, encountered a burglar Chinamen in the house, and engaged his attention till her husband came down and secured him.

A two-year old son of Gustave Rosenthal, of Olympia, Oregon, a few days since, fell into a tub of hot water. He lingered three or four hours in intense agony.

At Austin, Nevada, November 1st, reports from Belmont stated that intense excitement prevailed in that town in consequence of the recent strike and developments made in the Belmont mine.

At Colusa, Cal., Oct. 27, Coleman & Bros.' stables were burned, also nineteen horses, among them the mare Kate Hayes, valued at \$4,000. Coleman's loss, \$7,000. Insured, 4,000. Cause of fire—a mystery.

The Winnemucca *Register*, of Oct. 31, says the Idaho stage was robbed near Joe Snapp's, Oct. 30. The passengers were searched, the U. S. mail rifled, and Wells, Fargo's treasure box and three horses taken.

Simon Dempsey, of Sweetland, Nev., was found dead in his cabin, Nov. 29, of delirium tremens. He had in his hand an axe, with which he had hacked everything around in the cabin.

The "marriage in a balloon," which was to have come off at San Francisco, Nov. 1, did not come off. The balloon went up alone, by "a carefully arranged accident," it is said, and descended "under perfect control."

The Walla Walla *Statesman* says: "From Kootenai we hear remarkable stories about recent quartz discoveries, which, if one-half be true, are the richest and most extensive yet made on the coast. It is said that millions of tons are in sight, and that the gold can be seen with the naked eye. A gentleman who took some of the rock to San Francisco for the purpose of having it assayed returned in high spirits, and is confident that he is the possessor of an immense thing in the way of quartz diggings. Further particulars are awaited."

It cannot be denied that certain sharpers, with the aid of corrupt land officers and courts, have secured to themselves the title of extensive tracts of land in the State of California. In looking over the list we find the quantities running all the way up to nearly a hundred thousand acres. It is generally conceded that there was no honest way in which these titles could be obtained. It is undeniable that they cover some of the richest lands in the State. The cry has gone forth that some remedy must be found for this monopoly of the public domain. It is keeping people away from us. It is making a trackless waste, where there should be fine culture and smiling cottages. It is retarding the population of the State, and every branch of industry and commerce. There is one remedy, plain, simple, just and sufficient. It is to tax these lands at what is asked for them, or at least for what has been refused. Our next Legislature will not fail to instruct our assessors to this effect, and to so frame the law that the duty can no longer be avoided.—*Tulare Times*, Nov. 1.

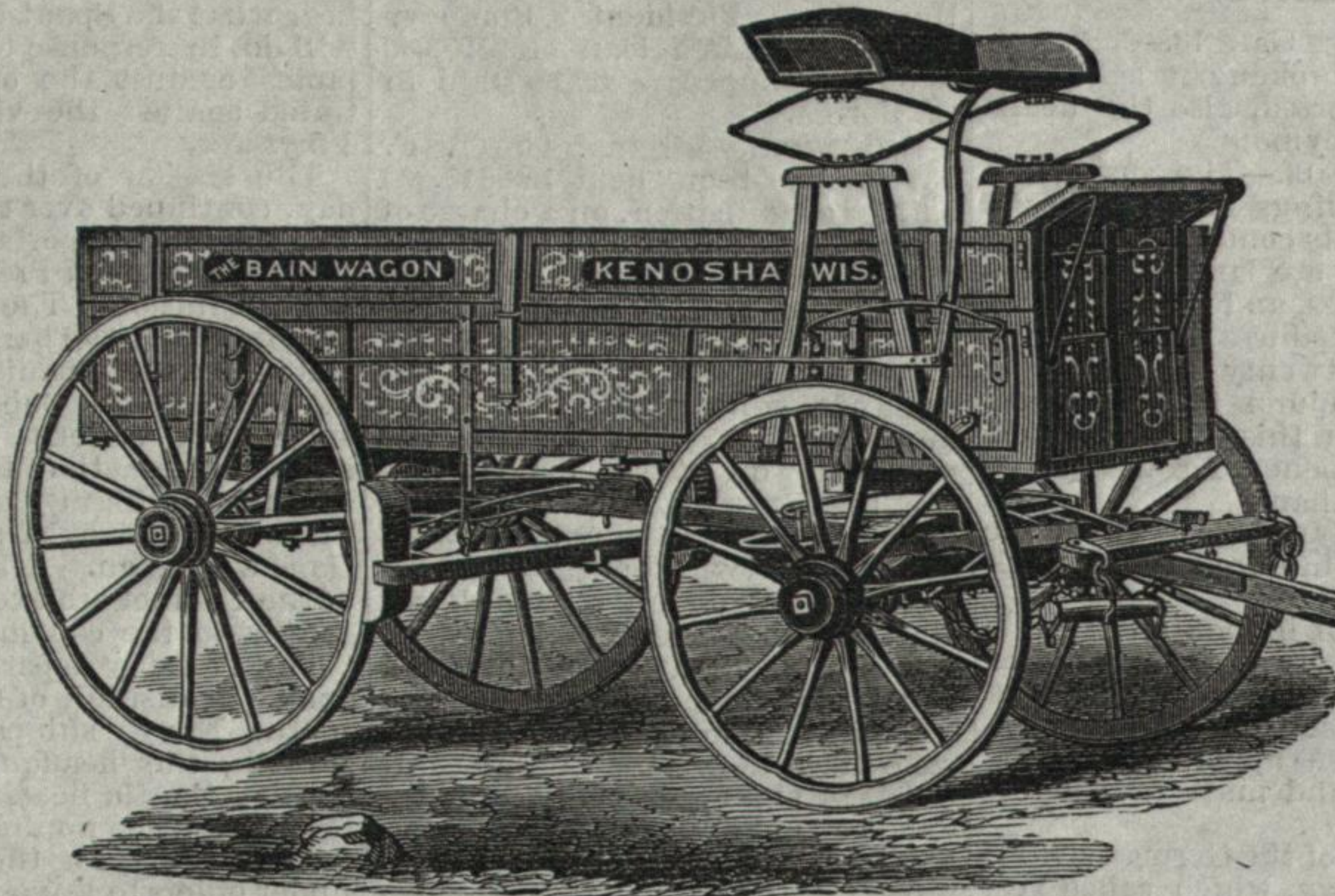

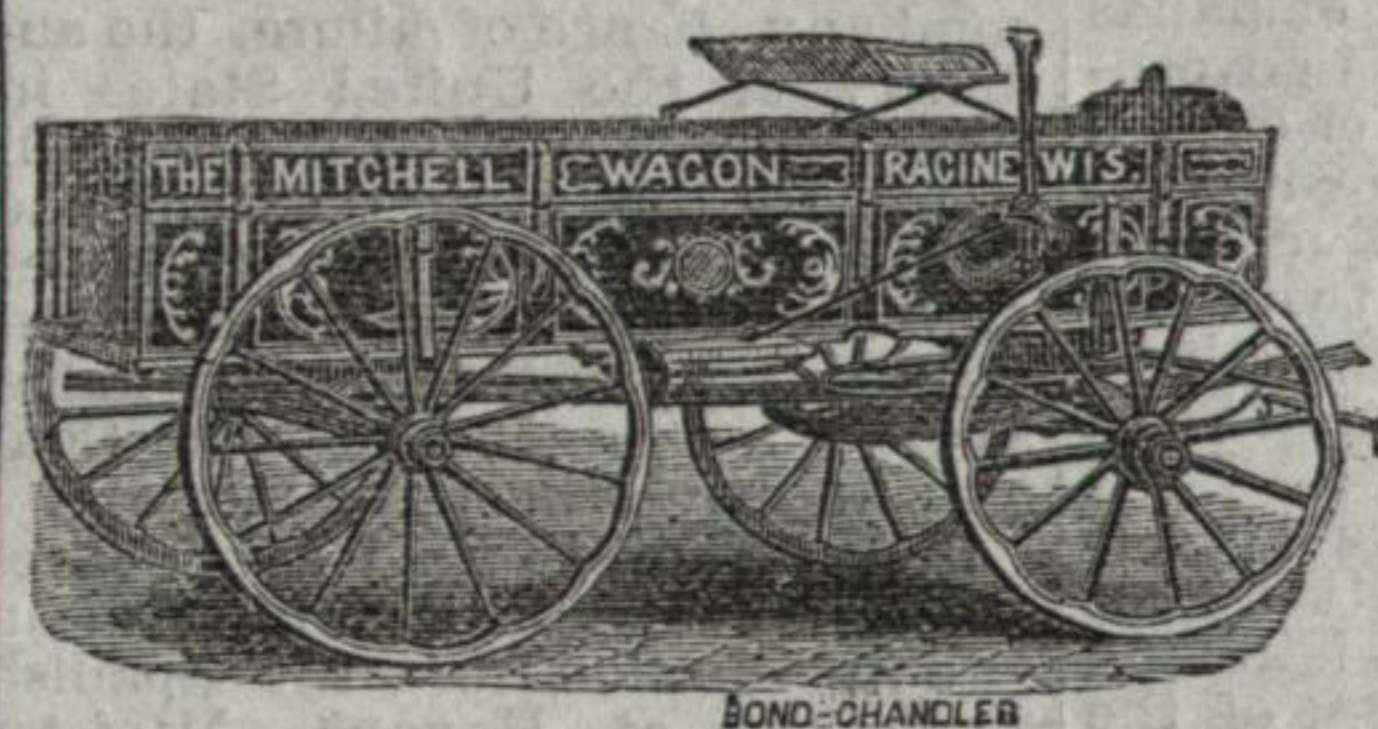

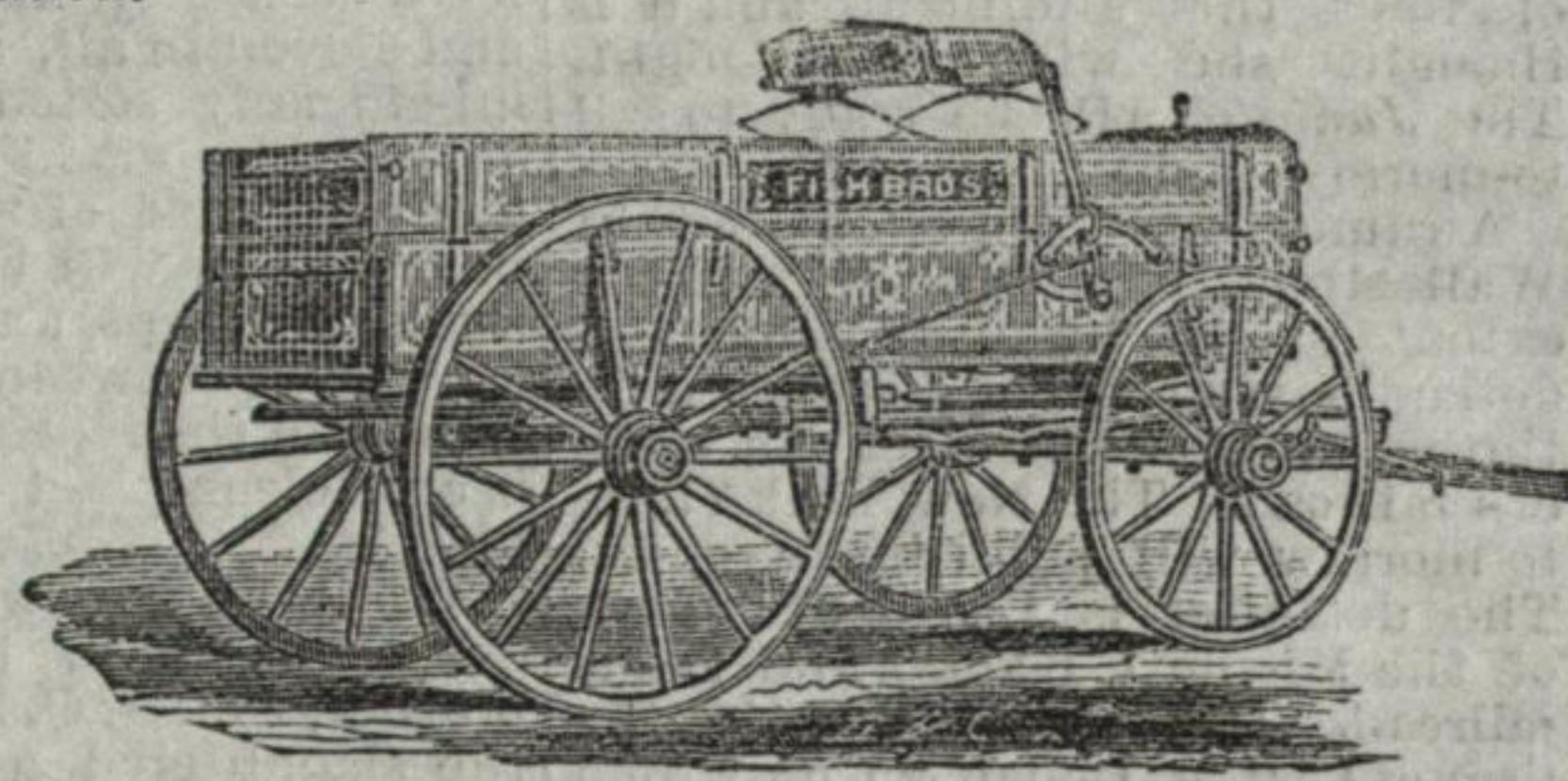
