PROVO.

PROVO, UTAH, AUGUST 12, 1893. THE INSANE ASYLUM. Contractors Will Wait for Their Cash - \$5000 Loan.

The regular session of the Territorial Insane Asylum board was held yesterday. The following business was transacted:

The sum of \$500 was appropriated to Henry Saunders for the construction of the escape ladder. The executive committee was instructed to have the ladder and the stand pipe extended to the deck of the roof of the administration building.

It was recommended by the executive committee that certain changes and repairs be made in the air duct and heating apparatus in order to economize fuel.

Judge Sheriff introduced the following resolution: Whereas, this institution is without funds to meet its current expenses and no funds can be gotten from the territorial treasury.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the asylum be authorized to borrow not exceeding \$5000, and not to exceed the credit allowed per annum, and to deposit any territorial warrants in his possession to secure payment of same.
