Minat Crop.

ST. PAUL, Minn., 25.—The wheat

harvest is generally in progress in

Minnesota. The reports from the

fields continue dismal, and the

allowance must be made for

disappointment of the extra

expectations. The estimate of a

25 percent deficiency holds good

for some of the southern counties.

Other districts will have nearly a

full yield. The estimates range

from 12 to 25 bushels per acre. The

deficiency in the crop will probably

be compensated for by the increased

acreage, making an aggregate

product of about the same as last

year. The quality will be much

lower, however.

Paris Exhibition—American

Exhibitors.

CINCINNATI, 25.—A. T. Goshorn

writes to Murat Halstead, from

Paris, saying that a careful observa-

tion of the American exhibits there

justifies him in saying that the

various adverse criticisms of the
