

LONDON, 20 .- In the House of

Lords this evening, Lord Oranmore called attention to the danger to the peace of Ireland from the agita-tions of Land Leaguers and Fenians, whose organs in America are largely circulated in Ireland. He cited the language of Parnell, O'Donell and Dillon to show their purpose to get rid of landlords by whatever means it could be done, and asked if the government had taken advice concerning the legality of the Land League organization, and whether the present state of Ireland does not call for extraordinary measures. Earl Spencer, Lord President of the Council, said: The Land League had not been created since the present Government came into power but had originated during the last Government, which took no legal opinion, nor had the present Gov-ernment. The Irish land agitation is most pernicious and dangerous to the peace of the country. It is not intended to immitate the late Gov ernment's abortive prosecutions The condition of several parts of Ire land is very grave, and deserves most serious attention, but no special legislation is intended. The Government thinks the common law sufficiently powerful to deal with the latter, and the Government is determined to protect life and property with all the means in its possession, and to maintain justice and

The Times, editorially, says: No thing that has happened in Ireland up to the present justifies the as sumption that ordinary law is inadequate to protect society against a mere handful of wicked and cowardly persons, and a large number of their foolish dupes; nor is any seri-ous importance to be attached to the wild rumors flying around of the revival of Fenianism. 'It is possible there are still some silly conspirators in certain Irish towns, most of them well known to the police, who are not cured of their inveterate passion for dabbling in treason. It would, however, be a very poor compliment to question their capacity of dealing have no connection whatever between the land agitation and the rumors of Fe nian projects. 




