OUTLAWS HOLD  
UP A VILLAGE

Shot at Every Man Who Appeared  
On the Streets.

Robbed the Postoffice.

Succeeded in Making Their Escape  
Without Leaving a Trace of Their  
Identity—At Ferndale, Wash.

Whatcom, Wash., April 14.—Two masked outlaws held up the village of Ferndale last night, shot at every man who appeared on the streets, robbed the postoffice of \$150, and succeeded in making their escape without leaving the slightest clue to their identity.

The outlaws made their first appearance in the postoffice, where they ordered the postmaster to deliver to them the contents of his till. The postmaster refused, and the two robbers with two revolvers in their hands kept him covered, the other emptied the contents of the till into a sack. Nothing but money was taken.

Four men who were in the office when the robbers came in were compelled to leave, the robbers firing their revolvers over their heads as they took their departure. Before leaving a dozen more shots were fired by the robbers.

The outlaws are believed by the authorities here to be the two convicts who last week broke out of the provincial prison at New Westminster, B. C., and who immediately made their way to Vancouver, where they provided themselves with firearms by burglarizing a hardware store.

The leader was incarcerated in the penitentiary at New Westminster under the name of Jones, but he has served two terms in the penitentiary in this state under the name of King. His companion's name is Clark. Tonight, however, they are guarding all the highways leading from the vicinity of the outlaws.

Battle with Outlaw McKinney.

Bakersfield, Cal., April 14.—A second battle was fought between Outlaw James McKinney and the pursuing officers at Keyesville, about four miles from Kernville, at the foot of the Greenhorn mountains, on Monday morning, a report of which has just reached here.

The pursuing posse was composed of Deputies McCracken and Rankin, who had the first fight with the outlaws at the south fork Sunday, reinforced by a number of others.

The details are very meager, but the officers unhorsed the bandit and captured his mounts, which accounts for his being seen at Isabella about later in the day. No one is reported to have been wounded.

Yale Student Drifting the Sound.
