It was raining at time of morning report at Denver and Grand Junction, Colorado, Portland and Roseburg, Oregon, and Omaha, Nebraska. Thunderstorms were reported over portions of Utah, Arizona and Nebraska.

The temperature was warmer, 12 to 20 degrees over portions of Utah, Idaho, Wyoming, Washington and the N. W. territories, with slight variations at other stations.

The barometer has fallen decidedly in all districts except lake region, Mississippi valley, southern Pacific coast, southern plateau and southern Rocky mountain slope.
